Course Expectations and Instructional Goals

This course is designed for college preparatory students desiring a formal background in mathematics. The depth of topics, the pace at which the topics are covered, the breadth of application of concepts and the expected retention of topics are substantial. It is crucial, therefore, that Algebra I Honors students assume a great deal of the responsibility for their learning.

Because this is a HIGH SCHOOL HONORS course, all students are expected to maintain a respectable average and show mastery of all material. If these conditions are not met, a conference will be held to determine if the student is to remain in the class.

- Rulers, colored pencils, markers, highlighters, thin dry erase markers, and loose-leaf graph paper will be helpful, but are not needed on a daily basis.
