

Family Justice Center's Used Shoe Drive

What: The Family Justice Center is conducting a shoe collection drive in 2016. Our goal is to collect 100 bags of shoes (25 pairs per bag) to raise funds to continue providing free and confidential services for victims of domestic violence and their children.

The shoes collected will not only provide funding for FJC services but will also benefit impoverished people in developing nations. Through the collections these people are able to start, maintain and grow their microenterprise to feed, clothe and house their families. Shoes are creating sustainable economies in countries where little hope of economic stability exists.

Wonders of the World

The Great Wall of China stretched for more than 13,000 miles, including all of its branches and fortifications. As many as 25,000 watchtowers studded the wall, which was primarily designed to keep out Mongol raiders and other nomads from the north. The wall was begun as early as 2600 years ago and was regularly extended, destroyed, rebuilt, and restored over the next 25-plus centuries. Most of what still exists today is about 400 to 600 years old, dating from the Ming Dynasty.
