Child Development &

Kindergarten Registration

Have you registered your son/daughter for Child Development (4 years old) and/or Kindergarten(5 years old)?

You will need the following for registration:

*Birth Certificate—The hospital copy will not suffice because it is not a valid document. We will need the one issued by the state in which the child was born.

*<u>SC Certificate of Immunization</u>—These may be obtained from the health Department or your family doctor.

*Social Security Card

*Three (3) Proofs of Residency—Any current bill with your home address on it, not a P.O. Box.

Georgetown County Schools offer a program for fouryear old children at each public elementary school. A child must be four years old on or before September 1, 2016 to register for the pre-kindergarten program.

All children five years old on or before September 1, 2016 are required to register and attend kindergarten unless parents sign a waiver accepting responsibility for their child not being in public school. This waiver is available at the school. Full-day kindergarten is available at all public elementary schools in Georgetown County.



<u>All</u> medications should be picked up by the end of the school day on Friday, June 3rd. According to GCSD policy, medications are only to be picked up by a responsible parent/guardian.

Any medications remaining at the school after Friday, June 3rd, will be destroyed. No medications will be held over the summer for use in the next school year.



STEM Education Aerospace Camp

SPACE EXPLORATION:

Monday – Thursday, July 11-14, 2016 9:00am – 12:00pm
This class is for students completing 5th - 8^{th} grades. Students will learn about where America is going next, including the International Space Station, the moon, near Earth Asteroids and Mars. Students will investigate and experiment with scientific principles relating to space exploration. They will interact with an educational specialist from the Johnson Space Center. Emphasis will be on critical thinking, problem solving and deductive reasoning skills. Cost: \$100 which includes tuition and all rocket materials.

SPACE CITIES:

Monday – Thursday, July 11-14, 2016 $12:30\,\mathrm{pm}-4:30\,\mathrm{pm}$ This class is designed for students completing 2^{nd} - 4^{nd} grades. Students will learn about living and working in Space, where astronauts sleep, how they eat, exercise, and spend their free time. They will design and build space stations in cooperative groups using recycled materials and participate in activities involving EVA assimilations, hands-on science experiments dealing with gravity, space mud and astronaut foods. Students will develop their imagination and creativity skills. They will learn about contributions NASA has made to improve the quality of life on earth. Students are welcome to repeat this class as many times as they like creating new space stations each year. Cost: \$100 which includes tuition and all materials.

The Instructors:

The teaching team will be composed of Connie Richardson Smith, an educator/consultant/Morningside College adjunct instructor. Co-teaching is Mary Richardson Tester, who teaches high school special education at Waccamaw High and Ben Tester, who teaches 7th grade science at Waccamaw Middle. Connie and Mary have successfully taught this aerospace science camp for many years adding new features each year. Both teachers have completed graduate work at the University of Iowa in Science Education through the Iowa Chautauqua Program. They have completed teacher training at the Johnson Space Center through the Space Exploration Educators Conference and Mary attended MoonKam training in Las Vegas through the Sally Ride Science Institute. Connie attended the International Space Station conference in Boston last summer sponsored by the American Astronautical Society. This summer we are fortunate to have Ben join the team to co-teach the Space Exploration Class. He is a recent graduate of the College of Charleston and a former student of Space Camp.
