
## Walking Your Child(ren) To Class


The workshop is open to parents who want the best for their children, and those who are

# **School ID Check-In Procedure**

In an effort to increase the security of our buildings we have implemented the Sexual Offender Auto Check for all visitors

Each guest must present a government-issued ID and wear a visitor badge during his/her visit.

This ensures that authorized guests are immediately identifiable to students and staff.

Acceptable forms of identification include a driver's license, state ID, etc.

We scan all visitors ID's against the national offenders database to help us identify potential threats.

- Insert your ID face up and horizontally into the Driver License Scanner
- Click Scan ID Your License will now be scanned Wait for a response
- Please fill out all other appropriate information and select check in
- If an alert arises, please notify the secretary
- A badge will print for you to wear during your stay
- Make sure you return this badge before you leave

### THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS MADE TO THIS PROCEDURE

We ask that all visitors during regular school hours cooperate with this process in order to help us maintain school safety.

This is important information to help keep our schools safe, and will be shared with first responders should an emergency arise.
