
## The Scholastic Book Fair is coming!

CogAT Testing Grades 2 and 3 November 3-5, 2015

The screening process for the Gifted and Talented Academic Program (BEACH) will continue with some testing taking place in the next two weeks. All students in grades two and three (with the exception of the students already in BEACH) will be given the *Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT)* on <u>Tuesday, November 3</u>, <u>Wednesday, November 4</u>, and <u>Thursday</u>, <u>November 5</u>.

The testing will occur during the morning hours, between 8:30 – 9:30 a.m. It is important for your child to be in school and arrive on time each day they are testing. Please help us to get your child ready for testing. Encourage your child to do their best by making sure they:

Get a good night's sleep;

Eat a good breakfast;

Arrive at school on time; and

Have a positive attitude.
