Fundraiser Survey Results

1. On a scale from 1 (extremely low regard) to 7 (extremely high regard), we asked people to rate their overall regard for this year's fundraiser. The most common answer was a 7 and the average of all answers was a 5.4.
2. 66% of people prefer one fundraiser. 33% prefer two fundraisers. 1% prefer three fundraisers.
3. 79% of people felt the goal amount per student (\$30 donation or sell 3 books) was just right. 10.5% felt it was too high and 10.5% felt it could have been more.
4. Next year, if we team with a company, 39% prefer Charleston Wraps (wrapping paper), 30% prefer Attraction Books, 18% prefer Wholesale Boutique (monogrammed items) and 13% provided other recommendations.
5. We received wonderful comments and appreciate each one. We are taking them all into consideration as we determine next year's fundraiser structure. Please email waccamawpta@yahoo.com with any other comments, questions or concerns.
