
Each student who recruits one presenting donor will receive a Red Cross flashlight!*

Lloyd Hall made significant contributions to society by developing new methods of food preservation and sterilization which eliminated spoilage and health hazards and enhanced efficiency and profitability for food suppliers.

Lloyd Hall was born on June 20, 1894 in Elgin, Illinois. He was an honor student while going to West Side High School in Aurora, Illinois and captained the school debate team while competing in baseball, football and track. Lloyd graduated High School in the top 10 of his class and had to choose between 4 college scholarship offers. He decided to attend Northwestern University, earning a Bachelor Degree in Pharmaceutical Chemistry in 1916. While at Northwestern, Hall went to classes with a student named Carroll L. Griffith who would later go on to become the founder of Griffith Laboratories. Following graduation, Hall attained a graduate degree from the University of Chicago.

These contributions to food preservation and sterilization revolutionized the way foods were prepared, processed, packed and transported, eliminating spoilage and health hazards and enhancing efficiency and profitability for food suppliers. In the course of his work, Hall would publish more than five scientific reports and receive more than one hundred patents. He also served as an consultant to the United States during two World Wars, served on dozens of advisory panels and boards and was given hundreds of honors and awards.

In 1959 Hall retired from Griffith Laboratories and moved to Pasadena, California where he died in 1971. He left behind a legacy as a leader in the field of food chemistry and is responsible for bettering health conditions in all areas of the food industry.
