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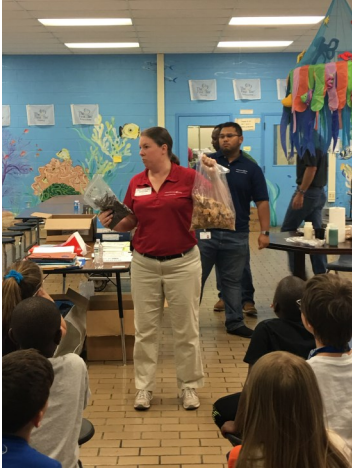

Our second graders would like to thank Mrs. Michele Dukes, Mr. Hassan Abel, Mr. Darryl Thomas, and Mr. Josh Fleming from the International Paper Company's Georgetown Mill for coming and sharing the process of how paper is made in our local mill. The students learned how trees are harvested from local tree farms, placed on logging trucks, transported to the mill and fed through many machines which processes it to be made into GI-ANT rolls of paper. The rolls are then sent out by trains and trucks to companies that make paper products from the GI-ANT rolls. Some of these products are; shoe boxes, tea bags, Amazon boxes, masking tape, and kites. The IP presenters also taught us about recycling and replanting. IP recycles all materials and water along with planting 4 trees for every 1 tree that is cut down. We love there slogan "PAPER is POWER"! Thanks again presenters.

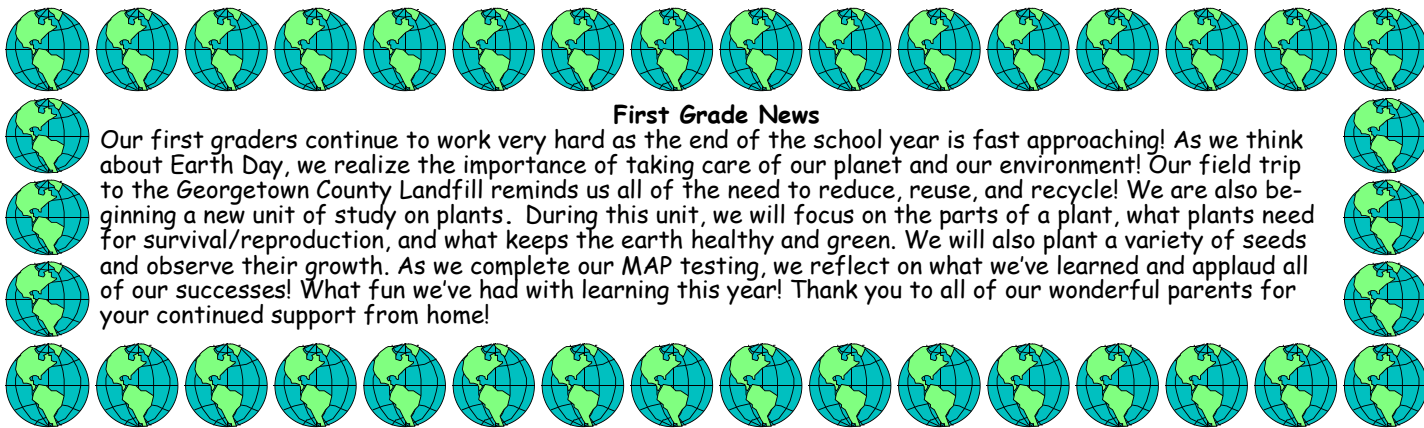
