Course: English III

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Course Description/Objective: English III is the first of four courses that students will complete as established by GCS and the South Carolina State Department of Education. - Creative writing (poetry, narratives, etc.)
- Analysis of rhetorical devices/strategies

*Student writing will be graded using the Literacy Design Collaborative (LDC) rubric. Additionally, students will have summative and formative writing conferences with their instructor that discuss mechanics, syntax, and content.

Second Chance Policy: In order to improve student learning and increase mastery of state objectives, students will have the opportunity to make up half of the points missed on a **major assessment** (test, essay, or project) by correcting errors on the original assessment and/or re-taking an assessment. ***The highest possible score a student can receive is an 85.*** This is to be completed by a date agreed upon by the student and myself.

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Academic Honesty:

Students are expected to uphold the highest integrity of academic honesty. Students should only turn in work that is theirs and cite any work that is borrowed, whether *quoted* or *paraphrased*. Work is constituted as papers, homework, class work, research, etc. **Plagiarism results in an automatic zero.**

Additional Classroom Resources:

1. Students will use Google classroom daily. Students may join my Google classroom using the code: **gfv8r2h**
2. Students will have online access to their textbooks. Students may access textbooks through the website my.hrw.com. Usernames and passwords will be distributed the first week of school.
