

FOOD BORNE ILLNESS PROJECT

You and your partner have been given the task of uncovering important documentation about serious FBI criminals known to man. These FBI criminals have been on the “Most Wanted” lists for years. It will be your job to create a profile on an FBI to help officials catch these deadly criminals.

Step 1: FBI (food borne illness) to research is _____.

Step 2: Use in class resources and the internet to fill in the information about your assigned FBI on the “Most Wanted” form.

Step 3: Use the information gathered to create a presentation about your FBI. You may use any program you want (PowerPoint, Prezi, Animoto...). Your presentation must include all of the following information. **AT LEAST** one slide per requirement but you can use more. Do not combine too much information on one slide.



- FBI Name
- Hideouts
- Crimes
- Prevention
- Photos of FBI (even if invisible to the naked eye), each slide should have appropriate pictures

Step 4: Save your project to your H drive. **You will be given 3 class periods to complete this assignment....use it wisely! Be sure to turn in your “Most Wanted” form and rubric.**

Step 5: Present your findings to the class. When you are an audience member make sure you are taking notes on the FBI and are being a respectful audience member.
