Waccamaw won the Bulldog Shootout, a pre-season tournament played over Thanksgiving break. The Warriors beat Andrews in the first round 63-49, and then beat C.E. Murray 60-30 to advance to the championship. Jawan Bryant scored a combined 35 points in these first two games, while Lach Dancy, Connor Heimberger, and Ty'Shaun Richardson also contributed in the games. The Warriors came out on top in the championship, beating Kingstree 51-38. Dancy led the team with 14 points, followed by Richardson and Ronald Thompson who both had 11. Bryant also put up 6 points and Heimberger had 4. The MVP of the tournament was Richardson, who transferred to Waccamaw this year from The Georgetown School of Arts and Science. Heimberger and Dancy were named to the all-tournament team. Coach Quinn was satisfied with the team's performance. "We've had a very balanced scoring attack with four or five players contributing every night," Quinn said. Heimberger said that winning the shootout was a needed boost of confidence. "We haven't come close (to winning) at all,"



Heimberger said. "We knew we could do it but no one else did. I think deep down we knew we were something special ever since we started practicing this summer and now we have gained even more confidence and we need to take that into the regular season."

Patrick Golden Signs with College of Charleston






