WHS Wins the Georgetown County Academic Bowl

Last Wednesday, March 1st, the Waccamaw High School Academic Team competed in Georgetown County's annual quiz bowl. The team, coached by Mr. Kibler

and Ms. D. Graham, was comprised of seniors Tucker Thaggard, Jonah Crosby, Ethan Shealy, Cole McCosh, and Ian Sovine, along with sophomore John Besser. Waccamaw won all four rounds beating Andrews High School 20-8 in the final game, making Waccamaw the district champion for the fourth year in a row. Tucker Thaggard scored the most points for the team with fourteen correct answers followed by Jonah Crosby with eight correct answers. Both Crosby and Thaggard made the district all-star team.

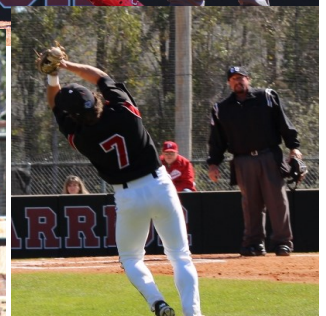
COASTAL INVITATIONAL
