

Charging Up the Warrior Way!






TEAM TAKES 2ND PLACE IN TOURNAMENT

Last Thursday, March 9th, the Waccamaw Track & Field team held their first home meet against North Myrtle Beach and Green Sea Floyds. The girls' first place finishers were: Briley Arnold in the 100m and 400m hurdles, Allison Mays in the 800m run, Annabelle Scully in the 1600m and 3200m run, and the 4X800 relay team (Arnold, Mays, Mary Butler DeSpain, and Scully). Second place finishers were: 4X100 relay team (Morgan Seganti, Ava Markham, Lauren Baker, and Isabella Pecunes), 4X400 relay team (Pecunes, Mays, Ella Fata, and Arnold), and the 4X800 relay team (Arnold, Mays, DeSpain, and Scully). The boys' first place finishers were: Jackson Junkins in the 100m, 200m, and 400m Dash, Tyfiq James in the 800m run, Rob Buffington in the 1600m run, Perrin Jones in the 3200m run, and the 4X800 relay team (Rion Keesee, Buffington, Jones, and James). Second place finishers were: Ryan Keesee and Jones in the 1600m run and Buffington in the 3200m run, 4X100 relay team (Tyler Gerali, James Alston, Bradford Thompson, and Mekhi Robertson), and the 4X400 relay team (Thompson, James, Gerali, and Robertson). For the girls' field events, Aaliyah Thomas placed 1st in the Shot Putt and 2nd in the Discus, Markham 1st (High Jump), Sam Kelley 2nd (Triple Jump), and Seganti 2nd (Pole Vault). North Mrytle Beach came in 1st overall, Waccamaw 2nd, and Green Sea Floyds 3rd.

Last Saturday, March 18th, the Track & Field team traveled to Wando High School where they competed in the Mellow Mushroom Relay against 29 other schools. The girls did an excellent job making the podium in three different events. Arnold, Mary Martin Olds, Samantha Kelley, and Despain placed 3rd in the 4X100m shuttle hurdle relay, Arnold, Fata, Scully, and Mays placed 2nd in the 4X800m relay and Lillian Eaddy, Fata, Zoë Dear and Scully placed 2nd in the 4X1600m relay. The boys, on the other hand, still have a long way to go until they reach the girls' record, but they were still able to place in one event. Thompson came out of the blocks cruising pass his opponents putting Waccamaw in 4th place. He passed the baton to Mekhi Robertson who zoomed pass everybody moving in 1st place. Robertson passed the baton to Junkins where he separated himself from the competition with a five second gap. Junkins passed the baton to Tyfiq James who was able to keep the lead and jog his way to the finish. The WHS boys' relay team placed 1st in their heat but 2nd overall for the Sprint Medley Relay (200X200X400X800).

On Saturday, March 11th, the Warriors varsity baseball team traveled to Brookland-Cayce High to take on the Bearcats. The Warriors were defeated 7-3, with Jaret Montenery and Dylan Leatherwood as the hitters.

On Tuesday, March 14th, the Warriors traveled to Dillion, with the Warriors winning 7-1, led by a complete game from Montenery, who also struck out 14 batters. Danial Rourk, the leading hitter, was 3-4 with a double and two runs batted in. Brecken Fox had a double and three runs batted in, Leatherwood had a single and one run batted in, and Jake Adkins had one RBI.

On Thursday, March 16th, the Warriors beat Georgetown in a walk-off fashion. Miller Brinson pitched a great game, going the whole game and allowing only one run. Going into the bottom of the last inning, the Warriors had only one hit and were down one run. Varsity picked up the first run in the 1st inning, but by the 3rd inning, the Bulldogs exploded with 7 runs in the 3rd and 11 runs in the 4th. Waccamaw could not recover from this losing the game 2-20. On Tuesday, March 21th, Varsity played Aynor at their home field. In a 5-inning game, the Lady Warriors icked up only one run (1st inning). 
