Junior-Senior Prom 2017 - Rules & Information for Prom

PRIOR TO PROM:

- Proper formal attire is required.
- Tickets will be sold at school during lunch periods.
- A WHS ID will be required for the purchase of tickets.
- Ticket prices are as follows:

*April 3-13, 2017

WHS Seniors - \$10 per person

WHS Juniors - \$20 per person

All Others (underclassmen and outside guests) \$30 per person

*After Spring Break - All tickets - \$50 per person

- Any student planning to invite a date who is not a student at WHS will need to have prior approval from Prom Sponsor Mrs. Tester and WHS administration. Contact Prom Sponsors before you purchase your tickets to get approval. *Mrs. Tester has the prom approval forms. You cannot purchase a ticket on the same day you turn in your approval form.
- All Prom attendees must be 20 years of age or younger and at least of high school age.
- Only juniors, seniors and foreign exchange students at least 16 years old enrolled at WHS and their dates are eligible to attend prom.
- One date per eligible student.
- Students must be present at school on Friday, April 28th through first period to be eligible to attend prom. Invitations will not be given out prior to this date and time to confirm school attendance. Invitations can be picked up upon parent approved sign-out or at the end of the day. The earlier you turn in your parent

note to sign-out, the faster it will be to pick up your ticket for prom. (In other words, try to turn in your parent note by Tuesday, April 25th). *PACE students can pick up their prom ticket at 9:15 am on Friday. *Remember, If you are a WHS student, you cannot pick up another WHS students' ticket even if it's your date. You can only pick up another ticket if your date is not a WHS student.

AT THE PROM:

- A WHS ID or SC driver's license will be required at the door when entering prom to verify entry.
- After check in at Prom, students will not be allowed to reenter if they leave.
- Seniors only will vote for Prom King & Queen as they enter the door on prom night. Crowning will be held at 10:30 p.m. at the prom. The winners must be present to accept the crown or the runners up will be crowned.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the building and outside on the premises.
- Anyone, regardless of age, who arrives at the prom under the influence of alcoholic beverages or any other illegal substance, will be denied entrance. Further legal and / or administrative consequences may result.



In the girls JV 1600m Run, Abbey Brockman came in 1st with Hannan Mackey in 2nd. In the girls varsity team, Annabelle Scully came in 2nd in the 1600m Run and 2 Mile Run, and 3rd for the 800m Run. Briley Arnold came in 2nd in the 400m Hurdles and 2nd in the 100m Hurdle Finals. The girls 4X800 Meter Relay team (Arnold, Ella Fata, Allison Mays, and Scully) also placed 2nd. From March 31st to April 1st, the varsity

boys soccer team played in the Carolina Cup at Airport High School in Columbia. The boys won one game, lost one, and tied one game. They beat Providence Athletic Club 5-0, tied with Gaffney 1-1, and lost to 4-0 to Dutch Fork.

On April 5th, all soccer teams played against Georgetown. The varsity boys lost 0-1 in penalty kicks ending their chance at a region title this year. This loss means a second seeding in the playoffs and likely a road trip to a top seed in the second round. The varsity boys have two games left to end the regular season. The varsity girls beat the Bulldogs 11-0 with goals by Juliette Gammel, Sophie Bennani, McCallee Watson, Mason Pinkerton, Hannah Lacy, McKenna Gulley, and Lena Gammel. The team is 11-5 overall and 6-0 in the region. Miller Brinson and Jaret Montenery both had two hits, Alex Nash had one RBI on one hit, and sophomore Caleb Colegrove hit a homerun to extend the lead to two runs. Colegrove's homerun was the first of his high school career and the first team homer for WHS this season.

Last Tuesday, April 4th, the Warriors played Aynor at Warrior Field. Going into this region matchup, there was a four-way tie for first place in the region between Waccamaw, Aynor, Lake City, and Loris. 
