Waccamaw High School has begun its first **Angel Tree** program to collect gifts and necessities for less fortunate students within the school and community. The program matches students in need and their younger siblings not yet in school with community members or groups willing to "adopt" a child and help provide them with a more exciting holiday experience - in some cases providing the only nice gifts that student may receive for Christmas.



Each year, school counselors along with the nurse work to identify homeless and other truly needy students in our school who could benefit from the program. They then compile a list of each child's needs and wants. Students will be assigned an Angel code number, so that identities are protected.

Presents should be delivered to the school for the particular angel before the district lets out for winter break. By the morning of December 16<sup>th</sup>, all presents will be in the angels' homes.


### <u>Grilled Cheese Grill Off</u> Contest in Foods 2 Class



Waccamaw hosted Aynor for the very last home game of the season on November 4<sup>th</sup>, and was defeated by a single point in a frustrating loss. Brandon Stecz connected early with Dominic Gullo for the first touchdown of the game. Stecz also found Tyree Funnye in the end zone a few drives later, giving the Warriors a 14-0 lead. Aynor soon put up their first points of the

game on a 30-yard touchdown pass on 4<sup>th</sup> and 30, and followed with a 2-point conversion. Aynor attempted an onside kick, but Gullo recovered it and ran it back. With the score at 21-8, in Waccamaw's favor, Aynor scored another touchdown. Aynor gained their first lead of the game late in the third quarter, with a touchdown run and a 2-point conversion. The Warriors answered with a 14-yard carry by senior Jordan Marshall, which put the Warriors on the goal line, and Stecz punched it in for the score. The Warriors faked the extra point, and Marshall passed to Josh Musiol for 2 points. With Waccamaw leading 29-22, Aynor scored yet again, and executed a 2-point conversion to regain the lead. The game winded down, and Waccamaw ended their last home game by a score of 30-29.

For the last game of the season, the Warriors took on Lake City. The Warriors fell 47-13, finishing the season at 1-9.




