This program is where people train

their dogs to be therapy dogs; they take the dogs to nursing homes and hospitals to spread joy. Mr. Hughes said, "These dogs love to be loved and the people light up when they see them."

For the animals to be licensed in the program, they go through 6 to 8 weeks of training and then the owner and dog complete an internship. It took about a year; he said it is very rewarding to see the smiles on people's faces from the love they receive from the animals.


Track and Field Update
