Waccamaw High School opened its doors for the 2014-2015 school year on Wednesday, August 20th. The cafeteria was buzzing as students greeted their friends, talked about their summer, found their homeroom teacher's name, and waited in anticipation for the first day to begin. For the first five days, students were on an altered bell schedule so they could attend homeroom, receive important information, and give new students a chance to get acclimated to their new surroundings. On the first day, homeroom teachers passed out schedules and showed a video presented by Dr. Hammel, Mrs. McCants, and Mr. Davis. The three administrators welcomed students to the new year and spoke about the rules and policies of Waccamaw High School. Some of the main things they talked about were ID's, dress code, electronic usage, tardies, lockers, and schedule changes.

For security purposes, students are required to wear IDs; visible at all times. Students without an ID cannot leave the classroom except during class changes and must wear a temporary ID. To be prepared for the professional world, students are not allowed to wear clothing that is too short, too revealing, or show visible undergarments. Any student not abiding by the dress code policy will be sent to an administrator and eventually to the ISS trailer if clothing cannot be changed. Electronic devices can only be used before school, during lunch, and after school. If a student is caught using the device, it will be confiscated. The tardy policy is enforced so students will be responsible and arrive to every class as scheduled and not be a disruption; any student caught in the hallway after the bell has rung will be immediately sent to the ISS trailer for the remainder of that class period.

Another major aspect of the first week of school was the locker/schedule-change procedure. During lunch on the first five days of school, Mrs. McClellan set up a table to assign lockers to any student who wanted one; Dr. Hammel and Mrs. McCants also set up a table, passing out and collecting schedule-change forms and talking to the students about whether or not their changes would be possible. If a student still wishes to get a locker, they can see Mrs. McClellan in the ISS trailer.

On August 20th, freshmen ventured into WHS for their very first day of their high school life while seniors attended their last first-day at Waccamaw. Let's make it a great year! GO WARRIORS!

Reminder: Juniors and Seniors

In order to attend a 4 year school, you MUST take the ACT or SAT, preferably before the end of the 1st semester of your junior year. You may need to test a couple of times before you get your desired scores and this will give you time to boost those scores when you retake. You should have the scores you want by the beginning of your senior year. Colleges will not accept you without scores. Please check your college's webpage to see what scores you will need for that institution for admissions.



America's Most Widely Accepted College Entrance Exam

The ACT® test assesses high school students' general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work.

The multiple-choice tests cover four skill areas: english, mathematics, reading, and science.

The Writing Test, which is optional, measures skill in planning and writing a short essay.

The SAT test measures students' basic knowledge of subjects they have learned in the classroom - such as reading, writing, and mathematics - in addition to evaluating how they think, solve problems and communicate.

Many college admission officers use SAT scores to help them assess a student's academic preparedness for college. However, the most important factor in college admission is the students' high school transcript - both the grades received and the rigor of the courses. SAT scores are intended to supplement the student's record and other information, such as extracurricular activities and letters of recommendation.


