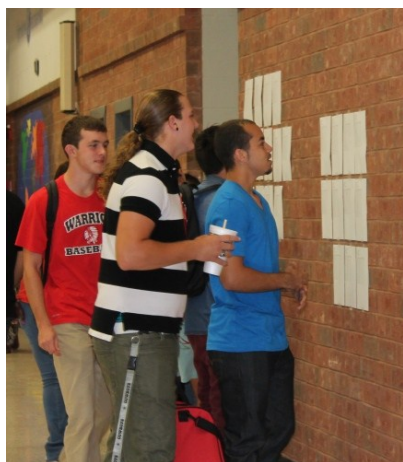

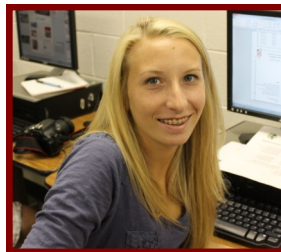

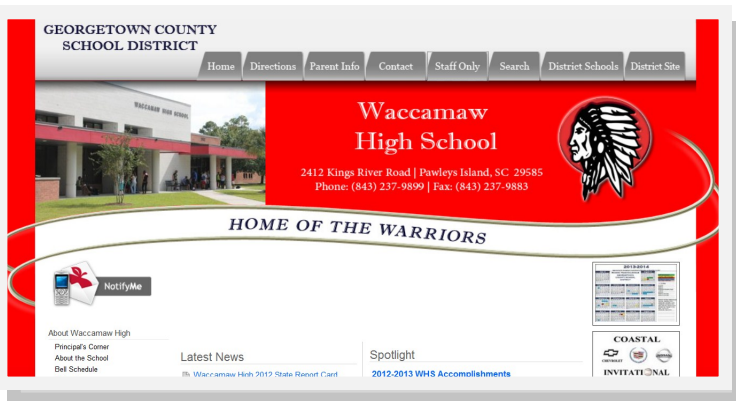

# Jack Monroe attends Palmetto Boys State

This past June I was granted the wonderful opportunity to attend the 2013 encampment of Palmetto Boys State at Anderson University. Upon first receiving the honor of representing American Legion Post 197 at Boys State, I was unsure of the experience that lay ahead of me. However, the many former Boy State citizens whom I met in the months

leading up to the camp ensured me that I would thoroughly enjoy the week, and I travelled to Anderson with optimism and a hint of nerves.

Palmetto Boys State is a week-long program that places over 900 of the best young men in South Carolina into an environment that fosters growth, leadership, and brotherhood. Everywhere you looked; there were Valedictorians, Team-captains, Student Council Presidents, Drum Majors, JROTC officers, and brilliant artists. I felt lucky just to put in the same room with these guys, and I was compelled to make the most of the week. At Boys State, the citizens build a mock state government from the ground up. Obviously, my campaigning needs a brush-up, because I lost both my city and county elections. But my favorite part of Boys State was the Law School. A two-day class led to a mock Bar Exam, on which I only missed one question and tied the highest score in the program's history. This propelled me to be elected as the Chief Justice of the Palmetto Boys State Supreme Court, and on the last day I even got to meet South Carolina Chief Justice Jean Toal and Governor Nikki Haley.

The greatest opportunity at Palmetto Boys State is the bond that grows between a citizen and his city. I was in the City of Chattooga (the cities are named after SC rivers), and I developed alongside 56 young men that at the end of the week I can call on as brothers. The Chattooga Toga Warriors had the best spirit at PBS 2013, which included wearing giant yellow togas in the South Carolina summer heat. I had lost my voice by the 3<sup>rd</sup> day! Chattooga had the greatest basketball team in the history of Boys State, winning the championship by 40 points. On the final day, we were presented the award for best all-around city, something that we came together to achieve as a group.

Attending Boys State is a life changing experience, and is truly tough to explain to someone who has not experienced it. I still talk daily with someone from Boys State, and I even just tweeted my PBS brother Okevious Conway, USC baseball commit ready to take the field for Gamecock fans in 2015 (Sorry, I had to)! I'm fortunate enough to be returning this summer as a Junior Counselor and hopefully enjoy another life altering week. If you're a junior and are interested in Boys State, I encourage you to talk with me or Mrs. Humowitz. We wish to make strong Palmetto Boys State delegates from Waccamaw High School a tradition! Go Warriors!

### Reminder:

#### All Juniors and Seniors

In order to attend a 4 year school you MUST take the ACT or SAT, preferably before the end of the 1st semester of your Junior year. You may need to test a couple of times before you get your desired scores and this will give you time to boost those scores when you retake. You should have the scores you want by the beginning of your Senior year. Colleges will not accept you without scores. Please check your college's webpage to see what scores you will need for that institution for admissions.



### America's Most Widely Accepted College Entrance Exam

The ACT® test assesses high school students' general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work.

The multiple-choice tests cover four skill areas: english, mathematics, reading, and science.

The Writing Test, which is optional, measures skill in planning and writing a short essay.

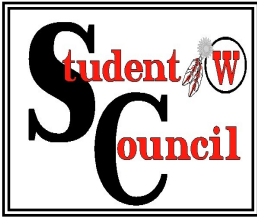

The SAT test measures students' basic knowledge of subjects they have learned in the classroom - such as reading, writing and mathematics - in addition to evaluating how they think, solve problems and communicate.

Many college admission officers use SAT scores to help them assess a student's academic preparedness for college. However, the most important factor in college admission is the students' high school transcript - both the grades received and the rigor of the courses. SAT scores are intended to supplement the student's record and other information, such as extracurricular activities and letters of recommendation.

One of our biggest events each year is Homecoming, which is September 30 to October 4 this year. Our council will host a district leadership rally on October 25, 2013. We are hoping to continue our tradition of being awarded as Council of the Year for the tenth time this year.



**Key Club (partnering with Kiwanis Club)** Key Club is for students interested in helping the community while having fun at the same time. **Spanish National Honor Society:**

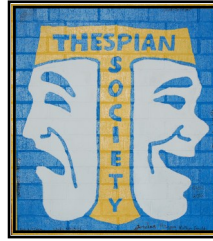
