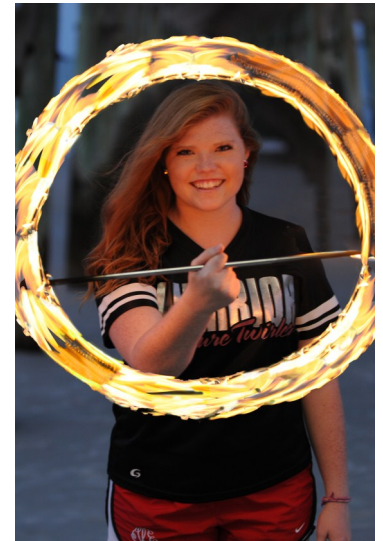

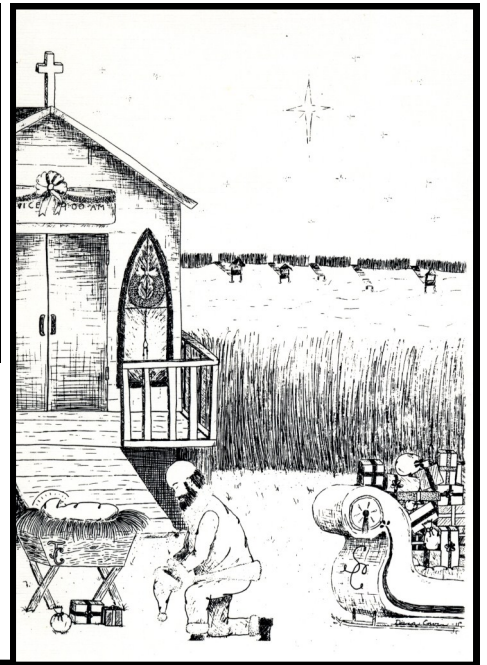

## **Competitive Cheer at the DRCCE**

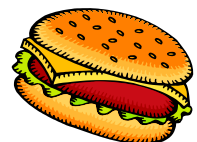


