The girls' team finished fourth overall in the meet. The boys top five runners were Robert Jones (16:32), Blake Marsh (17:13), Maddox Wilkinson (17:15), Grant Smith (17:21), and Todd Mauney (17:40). The girls top five runners were Amelia Jones (19:15), Briley Arnold (20:38), Jamie Barnett (21:07), Emily Heimberger (21:20), and Mary Butler DeSpain (21:30). WASA (Waccamaw Association of Space and Aviation) club was fortunate enough to have guest speaker, Kristi Schoenfelder, to speak at a WASA meeting Oct. 21st. Ms. Schoenfelder represents PIA (Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics) of the Myrtle

Beach area. She wanted to show WASA how aviation enthusiasts such as themselves might be interested in a career in aviation. PIA trains students right out of high school to become aircraft mechanics, now called aviation techs, where they learn the basics on repairing many different kinds of aircraft. PIA graduates airplane, jet, and helicopter techs with a starting salary of \$36,000.

The student goes to school for a period of 16 to 21 months and graduates depending on his or her field choices. Financial Aid is available for those who qualify and PIA was named a "Military Friendly School" for 2012 by *G. I. Jobs Magazine*. Want a higher degree than a Diploma or Certificate from PIA? PIA has a partnership with Horry-Georgetown Technical College so a student can also receive an Associate Degree. Ms. Schoenfelder told WASA while some of their friends will be flipping burgers when they are 20 years old PIA graduates will start in at \$36,000. **College Bound Student Athletes** are reminded to register with NCAA at www.eligibilitycenter.org beginning in 10th grade. Students must request guidance that submit transcripts at the end of your Junior Year and the final transcripts at the end of your Senior year. Students are responsible for registering, submitting test scores to NCAA, and requesting that transcripts be sent to NCAA.


