
Clothing Drive





College of Charleston Invitational Provides Education for Sailors

On Saturday and Sunday, November 15-16th, Waccamaw Sailing Club's Competitive team competed in 14 races at the second annual College of Charleston Invitational regatta. This event was designed to attract teams from outside the league



and to provide training opportunities by allowing coaches on the water. The College of Charleston has a full fleet of Club 420's as well as FJ's (Flying J's), which enabled 14 teams from distances as far as Florida to Maryland to race both their A & B divisions simultaneously with staggered starts. Typically, in high school sailing A divisions and B divisions sail separately with a two-race rotation format. This format proved challenging for all sailing levels as there was one fleet charging the leeward mark through the start line just as another fleet attempted to start.



Saturday's conditions were variable with light winds that decreased and shifted to the point of having to move the course because of the lee area created by the YORKTOWN. Sunday's conditions were a chilly 48 degrees with a constant drizzle and 6-8 knot winds.

Six of Waccamaw's sailors competed on Saturday with junior Griffin DesMarteau, freshman Sydney Register, and sophomore Colt Woodhouse in skipper positions and freshman Ella Grace Bodie, junior Michael O'Tuel and senior Will Golden in crew. Sydney Register and Colt Woodhouse also served as crew throughout the regatta. On Sunday, the team was represented by only four sailors, which required all of them to be on the water together for the remaining 5 races. DesMarteau (skipper) and Bodie (crew) sailed in A division and Register (skipper) and Woodhouse (crew) sailed B division.

The team finished 11th overall, with 257 points (131 points in A/126 points in B). The team sailed consistently better throughout the regatta climbing 2 places from Saturday in an extremely competitive fleet.




