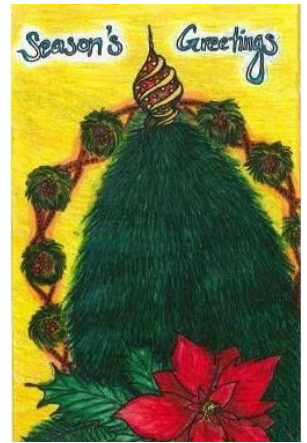

# Radio Control Demonstration

In October, Anne Marie Marozas, a technology support specialist for the Georgetown County School District, contacted me, knowing that I'm the advisor to WASA – Waccamaw Association of Space and Aviation club. She asked Bill Pritchett, a flying Radio Control (RC) enthusiast, to contact me. I emailed Bill Pritchett and found that he is the Director of Education for the AMA – Academy of Model Aeronautics. AMA is an organization promoting safe and responsible RC flying, bringing students and adults together through memberships and AMA sponsored events. Pritchett and his son Greyson, who is also a flying RC enthusiast, just happened to be heading toward our coast to participate in the AMA and NSRCA-National Society of Radio Controlled Aerobatics sponsored event called the "Green Sea Precision Aerobatic Contest" held on October 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. This consisted of four AMA classes that include sportsman, intermediate, advanced, and masters, where Greyson was entering advanced for the first time. On October 16<sup>th</sup>, before the event, Pritchett and his son Greyson visited WASA and performed an RC demonstration for the club. Coach Jeff Gregory was kind enough to let us use the baseball field which made a wonderful flight field allowing plenty of room to fly.

In the back of Pritchett's SUV were several RC aircrafts. They got out an airplane, a helicopter, and a drone for the WASA demonstration. Greyson started out with his E-flite aerobatic electric airplane. The little stunt plane took off in what seemed to be less than seven or eight feet on the dirt baseball field; he flew almost straight up and rolled over level. After a moment of maneuvering, he started to fly upside down. Not long after that, he flew the stunt plane on its side for some distance. Greyson then landed the airplane in the grass in about three feet of space. I would not have thought any RC aircraft would take off and land in such a short distance powered by an electric motor.

Greyson picked up his helicopter, costing over a thousand dollars, and used his remote control to fly it over the baseball field; he hovered it in the air awhile and then flew it around the field, turned the helicopter upside down while flying it around the field, and brought it in for a landing while his dad talked about the helicopter and RC flying.

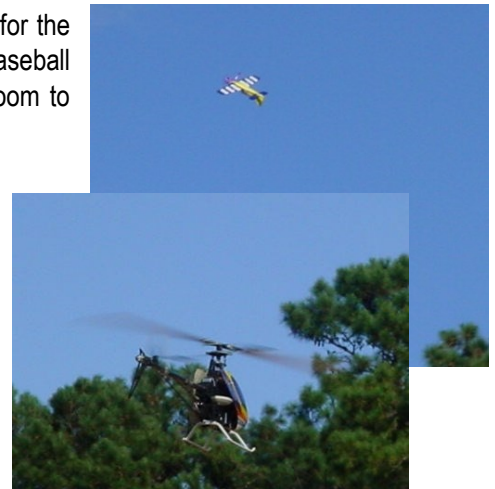
After impressing WASA with all kinds of trick-flying stunts, Greyson got out his RC drone. He took his transmitter flying the drone straight up, hovered for a moment, flying it all around the field just a short distance, flipping the drone several times, and landing. As Greyson was flying, his dad was speaking to WASA about each aircraft that his son was flying and added some RC tips. Pritchett warned WASA members not to let their hands get caught in the propeller of an RC; he said a gas powered propeller would strike you and stop if your hand wandered in its path, but an electric powered propeller would not stop and would continue turning, damaging your hand. He warned WASA members to stay clear of turning propellers powered by gas engines or electric motors.

Just before the pair left, Pritchett gave me some handouts allowing all WASA participants to join the AMA for free; the membership entitles WASA members to go to any AMA approved field to fly RCs. All in all, it was a great day to experience RC flight with such a talented young person and listen to a great speaker.

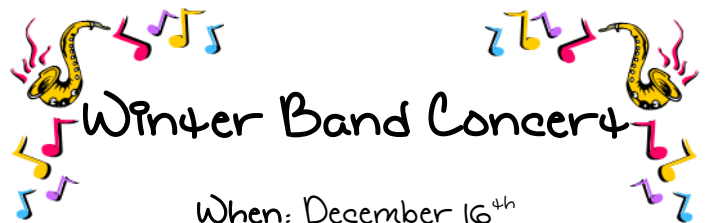
## DAR GOOD CITIZEN AWARD

On Thursday, December 4<sup>th</sup>, both of Ms. Graham's AP Calculus classes traveled to The Boeing Company's plant in North Charleston, South Carolina. The students participated in the Boeing DreamLearners program, which included a guided tour through the company's Tour Balcony overlooking the production floor where new 787 Dreamliners are being manufactured. The guide explained that the Dreamliners are

composed of a carbon fiber composite rather than aluminum and use state-of-the-art wing design in order to greatly reduce fuel consumption. Various other features of the manufacturing method were explained through a short video and interactive models. Then, the students competed in a ten-minute challenge to build the best paper airplane, emulating the processes in which a real plane is made. The group members were each assigned a specific role, which they could not work outside of, and each plane had a specific budget to work within. The planes were flown for the greatest distance and the winning group received a few Boeing souvenirs,

such as a poster and Dreamliner medallion. The final part of the tour consisted of short informative sessions with two employees who explained how they came to work for Boeing and the careers they now hold. The students left the complex around mid-day and travelled to King Street for lunch. After a few hours to relax in downtown Charleston, everyone returned to the bus and headed back to Waccamaw.

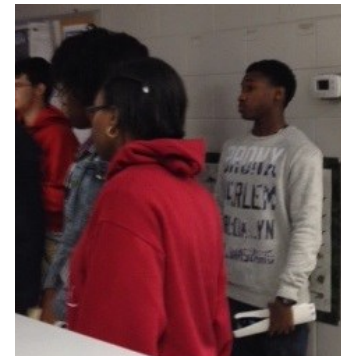
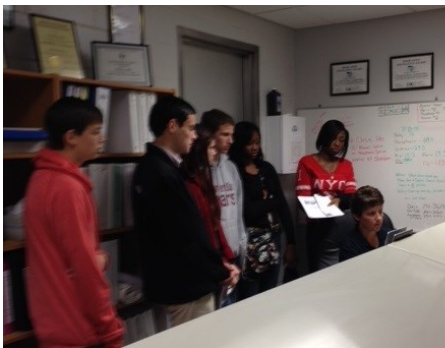

It was a hard-fought, close game with the Warriors never trailing more than 2 points in a quarter. Rob Ferraro led the team in points with 16. The team record is now 5-3.

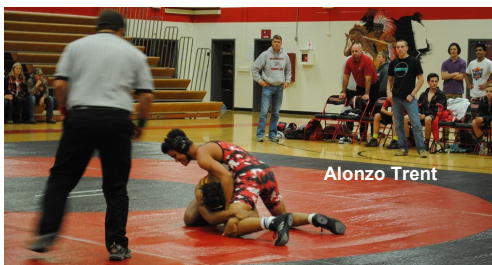

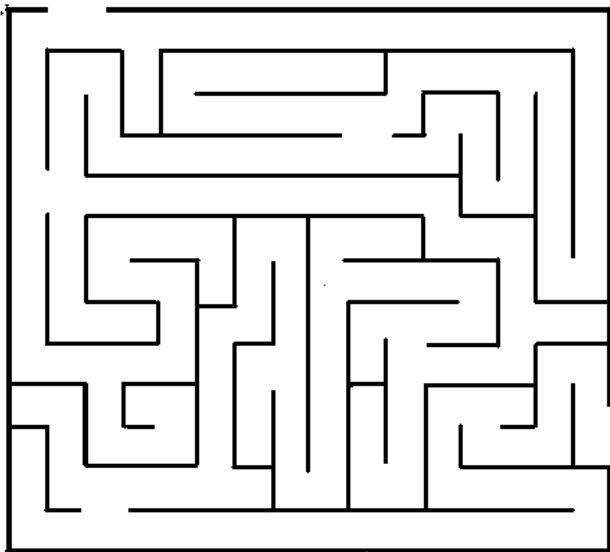
