A: People are in for an awesome show! We have got some really cool stuff planned for this show and there's going to be a lot of people there! I'll tell you right now, you do not want to miss this show!

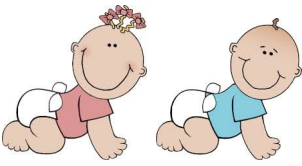
Q: *Have you played with any other bands before?*

JV Girls and Boys

Last Thursday, Dec. 5th, the boys and girls JV basketball teams traveled to Murrells Inlet to play against the St. James Sharks. The girls completely dominated the Sharks throughout the entire game finishing with a score of 33-14. The top three scorers were Davion Funnye with 18 points, Samirah Murray with 6 points and Jazmyn Torrance with 3 points. The boys lost with a score of 44-40.

The Sharks traveled to the Warrior coliseum last night, Dec. 12th, giving the boys a chance to redeem themselves and the girls a chance to take another win. The results were not available at press time.

Varsity Boys

On Friday, December 6th, the Varsity boys took home an exciting win against St. James with a score of 68-56. The teams battled back and forth until the 4th quarter when junior Jemon Smalls scored three consecutive three-point shots, immediately intensifying the game. Jemon earned 15 of his career best 25 points, Rob Ferraro had a season high of 17 points, Adonis Williams scored 13 points, and Jack Dwyer scored 8.

On Monday, December 9th, the team traveled to Christian Academy to face the Saints for the second time this season. The Saints rebounded from their previous loss taking the win with a score of 72-63. The top three leading scorers for Waccamaw were Jemon Smalls with 18 points, Adonis Williams with 13 points, and Rob Ferraro with 12 points.

The Varsity girls played a tough game Friday night (Dec. 6th) against St. James. The girls led the game in the beginning but by the end of the first quarter, the Sharks began to dominate the court. The girls played hard but unfortunately lost to St. James with a score of 41-30. The top three point leaders for Waccamaw included Kadijah Smalls with 9, Madeline Hoffman with 7, and Alexis Grove with 6.

The James F. Byrnes Scholarship Program was established in 1949 to assist young South Carolinians who had lost one or both parents to obtain a college education. Since that time, the Byrnes Scholarships have been awarded to over 1,000 students. The annual award of \$3,250.00 is applied for each year of a four-year bachelor's degree program. The scholarship is renewed annually contingent upon the recipient's maintenance of satisfactory academic standing, need for financial assistance, and participation in Byrnes Scholar activities.

In order to be eligible for the James F. Byrnes Scholarship, a student must:

- ◆ Have one or both parents deceased
- ◆ Be a South Carolina resident and United States citizen
- ◆ Plan to pursue a bachelor's degree at an accredited 4-year college/university
- ◆ Have a satisfactory academic record
- ◆ Have received their SAT/ACT score
- ◆ Demonstrate excellence in character, ability, and enterprise to indicate that the student will make worthwhile contributions to society
- ◆ Have need for financial assistance in order to attend college

Applications must be submitted after Jan. 2 and before Feb. 10.

Dental sealants have been proven to prevent decay and keep decay from increasing.

Who we are:

South Carolina Dental Screening Associates, LLP and Classy Smiles, Inc. are privately owned organizations (profit and nonprofit) whose Registered Dental Hygienists (RDH's) go into the schools throughout SC to provide preventative dental services to children ages 3-18. Parents do not have to miss work and students do not have to leave school, so regular preventative care is easily managed. We will service your child every 6 to 9 months.

During your Child's School day our Registered Dental Hygienists (RDH's) provide:

- Dental Screening - Dental Cleaning - Fluoride Treatment - Dental Sealants

What Are Sealants?

A screening report will be sent home with your child on the day they receive services. The report will tell you what services were performed, the condition of the child's mouth and if follow up care with a dentist is advised. If any follow up care is needed, a list of dentists in your area will be included and sent home with this report.

Completing The Form

Fill out form on back, please print clearly. You must sign at bottom of form on other side or we cannot service child. Medicaid and Dental insurance will not cover a cleaning and a fluoride more than once every six months. Medicaid and Dental insurance will still pay for an exam, x-rays, fillings and etc. in a dentist office if your child's teeth have been cleaned and or sealed at school. It is a parent's choice of where and who provides services, so why not have it done conveniently and inexpensively while your child is at school.

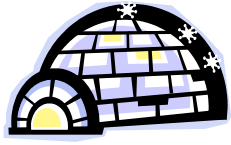

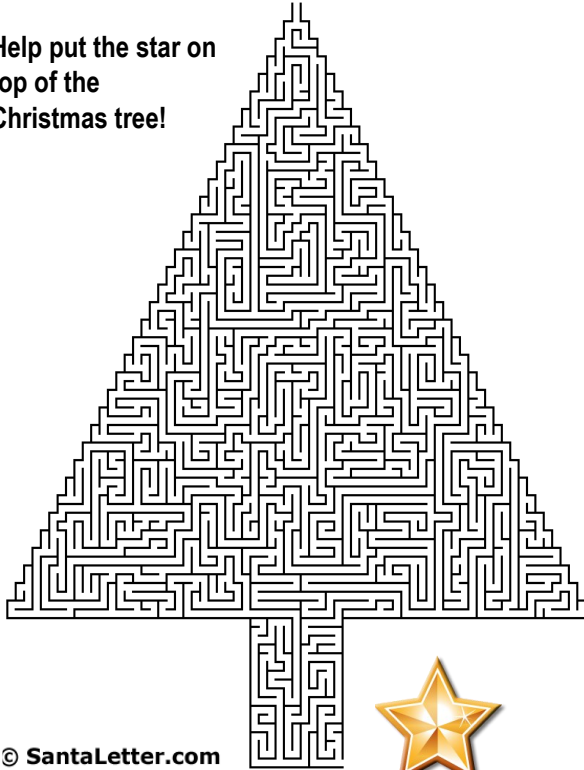

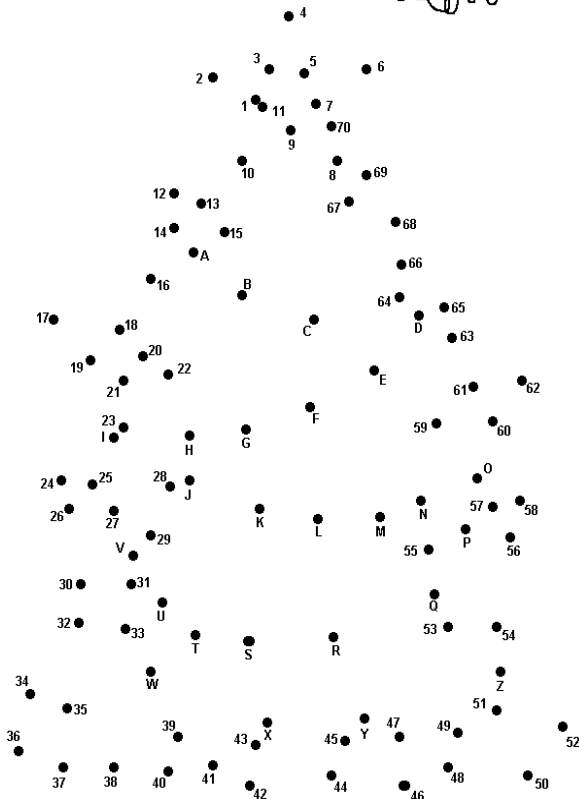
