The team was determined to find a win against the St. James rivals after suffering a tough loss against Carolina Forest. Waccamaw's starting pitcher, Carter Fox, struggled early on but eventually settled in and pitched a great game. Forrest Powell also did a great job pitching in relief. At first, the game was close and it looked as if it would come down to the wire. However, with a couple of clutch hits with players on base, Waccamaw established a good lead and began to pull away from the sharks. The Warriors ended the game with a 12-6 lead; a great win for the Warriors!

On February 5th, the Waccamaw Warriors JV basketball teams faced off against the Aynor Auctioneers. The girls finished their game with a 3-point lead, beating the Auctioneers 24-21. Leading scorers were Jabraya Brown and Jonequa Barr. The boys' game came to a conclusion with the team winning by a huge margin of 49-29 against the Auctioneers. Leading scorers were: Quez Brown, Jawan Bryant, and Connor Heimberger.



On February 12th, JV played their last game of the season. The girls lost 22-29 to the Dillon Wildcats. Coach Schaefer said, "It was the best game we played all season and we fought hard to the end and even came back from being behind by 10 points." Leading in points were Tamia Menendez with 11 points and Braya Brown with 5 points. The girls ended the season 4-14. Schaefer described the season as a continual improvement; "Each player worked hard to commit to the team and never gave up."



The boys' team led in points for the first three quarters of the game but were unable to hold that lead resulting in their 5th loss of the season. The JV boys ended their season with a 3rd place finish in the region and a 15-5 overall record. Coach Sickamore said, "I could not be prouder and I am looking for their continued improvement in the future. The players, coaches, and parents have bonded to form a nucleus for a bright outlook in the future for Waccamaw High School."

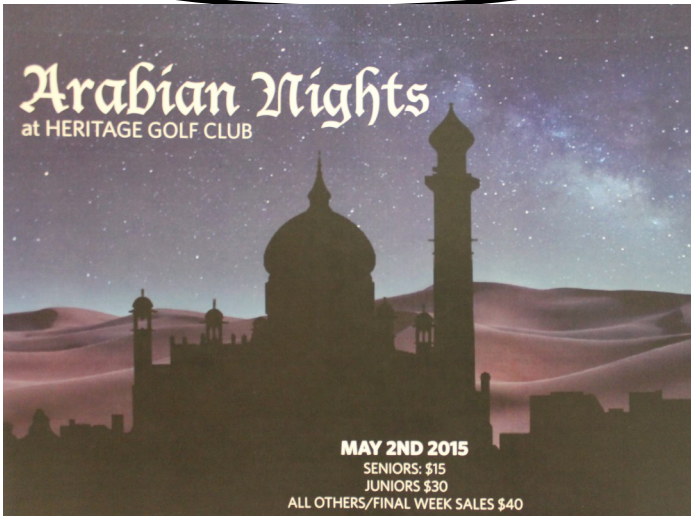
