Waccamaw Helps Those in Need







The South Carolina AHEC Summer Careers Academy will host a one-week summer program in collaboration with the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) Colleges of Nursing, Dental Medicine, Medicine, Health Professions, MUSC Library, and the South Carolina College of Pharmacy. The program was designed to help underrepresented minority and disadvantage students prepare for entry into nursing, dental, medicine, pharmacy, physician assistant, and occupational therapy training programs within South Carolina.

Eligibility Requirements

All applicants must:

- Be a South Carolina resident or enrolled in a South Carolina school, college, or university
- Be 18 years old on or before June 6, 2015 NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Demonstrate a sincere interest in a field of nursing, dental medicine, medicine, pharmacy, occupational therapy, or physician assistant
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Be currently enrolled in, or accepted for enrollment by an accredited college or university for the fall of 2015 with an interest in pursuing a career in a designated Academy career path
- Applicants to nursing medicine, occupational therapy, or physician assistant tracks must have completed graduation/ GED requirements prior to June 5, 2015
- Dental and Pharmacy Career Applicants must have graduated from high school by December 2014 and earned a minimum of 12 hours of academic credit from an accredited college/university
