




Just a week before the State Wrestling Championship, wrestlers Arman Singh, Shea Burke, and Tyler Davis won the Lower State championship in their individual weight classes qualifying them for state. Bobby Walters, Alonzo Trent, and Omar Lopez also qualified for the state championships by placing in the top four at Lower State.

This past weekend, the wrestlers traveled to Anderson to compete for the individual state title. 
## Lights, Camera, Prom!


