Last Friday, May 2nd, the boys and girls track teams traveled to Marion, SC to compete in their region meet.



area. The even-


ing closed with a tribute to the Beatles. with

SOCCER ENDS THEIR SEASON AS "REGION CHAMPS" AND GETS READY FOR THE PLAYOFFS





Varsity Ends their Season in the 3rd Round of Playoffs




