BOYS TENNIS TEAM IS LOWER STATE CHAMPIONS!

On Monday, May 12th, the Waccamaw boys' tennis team played against Academic Magnet. The opposing team, only bringing four players, had to forfeit. However, they still played for fun. The four singles players: Scott Johnson, Thomas Rowland, Ben Hewes, and Justin Dunn all won their matches. Parker Brinson and Woodrow Tudor won their doubles match while Jacob Hawkins and JD Tucker suffered a loss. In the end, Waccamaw won 5-1.



With one loss and one win against Bishop England, Waccamaw faced the opposing team once again; this time for the Lower State Championship title. On Wednesday, May 14th, Waccamaw came out strong with Jaz Greene, Ben Hewes, Paul Hendrix, and Joey Hewes all winning their singles matches, securing the Lower State Championship title. Playing No. 2, Justin Dunn lost in a third set tie-breaker, 6-4, 3-6, 10-7. Doubles duo Parker Brinson and Woodrow Tudor were scheduled to play, but the coach from Bishop England invoked his right not to play his doubles team since the match was already decided. Coach Hunt said, "Although we implored Bishop England to play the doubles matches, it was a great disappointment to our team and to Brinson and Tudor, who trained long and hard, producing a powerful and imposing force to clinch this match." Waccamaw beat Bishop England 6-1. Congratulations, Warriors! With this win, Waccamaw will play for the State Championship in Columbia on Saturday, May 17th. Good luck!

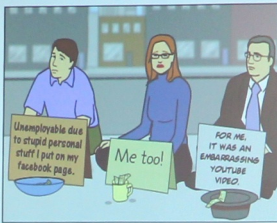
BUY A FOWL CUPCAKE!

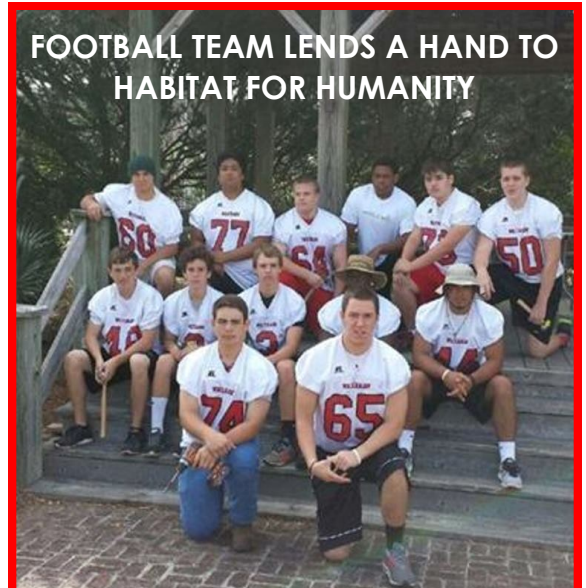
Life After High School

Last Saturday, May 10th, the Waccamaw High School softball team traveled to Dillon to take on the Wildcats in their first game of the Lower State tournament. WHS was leading 5-0 after the 2nd inning until the Wildcats scored 5, tying the game in the 7th. The Lady Warriors scored 3 valuable points in the 8th and held the Wildcats for the 8-5 win. The leading hitters were Emily Heimberger, Hallie Butler, and Olivia Dunlap.

On Tuesday, May 12th, the Warriors fought hard for a 10-3 win over Barnwell. McKenzie Lugin, the winning pitcher, led WHS with a 3-run triple. The leading offensive hitters were: Isabel Sanchez, Emily Heimberger, Hallie Butler, Leah Boghosian, Sam Tansey, and Nina Lowenbach.

Waccamaw will host the class AA Lower State championship game tonight against Dillon. With one win, the Lady Warriors will claim the title, otherwise, a second game will be played to determine the champion.



On Wednesday, May 14th, Justin Colegrove signed with USC Salkehatchie to play baseball. Justin has been playing on the WHS varsity baseball team since his freshman year. In 2013, he was named All-Region Player, All-State Player, and team MVP. Hawg Hunters Take First Place in All Events

On Saturday, May 3rd, Waccamaw High School Hawg Hunters hosted the Fishing Team Open Redfish/Bass Fishing Tournament at Carroll Campbell Marine Complex in Georgetown. Coach Matthews had eight Hawg Hunters compete: Chase Daniels, Dequan Mazyck, Jacob Tester, Collin Newton, Blair Avant, Kane Travis, Cole Miller, and Conner Summer. Conway High/Middle had 12 students compete. After a blast off at 7:00am from the Sampit River, teams of two set out to find the fish. Conner and Kane traveled to the Pee Dee River where they caught four largemouth bass on top water lures. The pair later went to the Black River at high tide where the redfish bit artificial minnows. Collin and Chase caught fifteen largemouth bass in the Sampit River on stick baits and crank baits. At the end of the tournament, prizes were awarded in the Largemouth Bass division, Red Drum division, and biggest fish. Each boat was allowed to weigh-in two fish in the Bass and Red Drum division. Waccamaw did very well. Collin and Chase won 1st place in the Largemouth Bass Division with a total weight of 4.49 lbs. with Conner and Kane placing 2nd with a total weight of 3.26 lbs. Chase received the award for the biggest fish weighing in at 3.11 lbs. and Conner and Kane won 1st place in the Red Drum division with a total weight of 2.81 lbs. Congratulations, Hawg Hunters!
