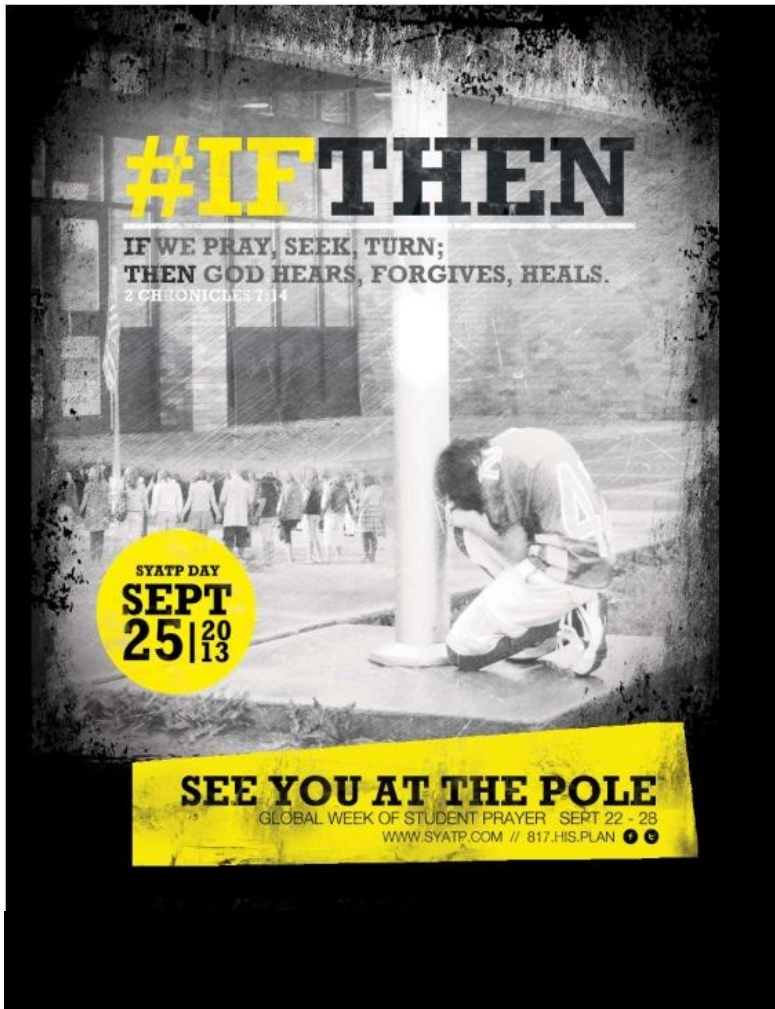

WHS sophomores Griffin DesMarteau, Jacob O'Tuel and Michael O'Tuel presented plans to start a sailing club to the board on September 3<sup>rd</sup> and were hoping to receive the Boards blessing to move forward with plans, but had to wait two weeks while the board discussed and dug a little deeper into the plan. Dr. Dozier announced on Tuesday that since the request was coming from a club, not



unlike many other clubs throughout the school district that are done outside the boundary of the schools, that the Board did not have to vote. Great news, because Waccamaw High School Sailing Club has 47 students signed up who are raring to go!



When Griffin DesMarteau met with Dr. Hammel last May to ask permission to get started with a sailing club for the school he never imagined it would happen so fast or that there would be so much support in the community. "It's awesome, and it seems like so many people love sailing. Lots of them learned at camp or scouts and are excited about being able to compete for the school," said DesMarteau. Not only was Dr. Hammel and the School Board excited, but the community has been so supportive as well. The Waccamaw Sailing Club accepted a \$2000 donation from the

Rotary Club of Pawleys Island on September 19<sup>th</sup>, the first full boat sponsorship for the newly established program. With the generous donation from the Rotary Club, the challenge grant from the Matthew Britton family, the continued support and kind donations from Hazzard Marine and the overwhelming interest from the community, the Warriors are ready to throw off the bow line and get sailing.

Practices are after school Tuesday and Thursday's at Hazzard Marine in Georgetown. More than 47 students are signed up to participate in the club--more than double the amount on the Wando High School team! The team was not able to participate in the regatta held over the weekend, but 18 teams from all over the southeast raced in Charleston Harbor. 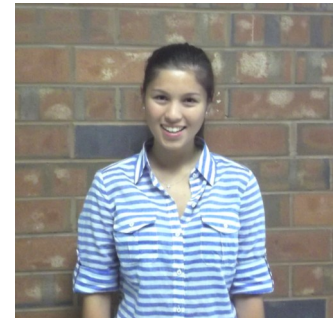
## Luise "Lolo" Herold
