




## CLEAN OUT YOUR CLOSET FOR THOSE IN NEED






#### College Application Day at WHS

Sometimes it can be confusing and a bit overwhelming trying to apply for college online. Sponsored by the SC Commission on Higher Education, Wednesday was designated as "College Application Day" to give students an opportunity to fill out applications online in the computer labs with some assistance. Coordinated through the guidance department and the students' U.S. Government classes, seniors who completed their resource guide were given time to complete their application(s) online. Parents were also invited to participate with their child(ren). The students




who participated received goodie bags, were placed in a drawing for door prizes, and if they filled out at least three applications, received a certificate from Medieval Times and placed in a drawing to win an iPad. For College Day, twelve schools waived their application fee, which can typically cost between \$25-\$70 (on average) per application. 




