# Having a Blast at the Beach Band

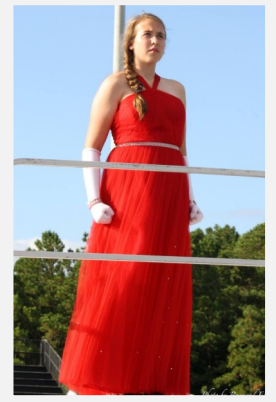
