



S.C. Radon Poster Contest

Radon is a colorless, odorless, tasteless, and radioactive gas that forms when uranium breaks down in rocks and soil. Radon gas moves through the ground to the surface and can enter homes and buildings, but there is no way to know the radon level unless it is tested; testing for radon is important because radon is the leading cause of lung cancer in non-smokers. The S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control is sponsoring its sixth statewide radon poster contest. Help spread an important public health message by entering this contest!



JV Football Picks Up Another Warrior Win!

Last Thursday night, October 2nd, the JV football team played the Mullins Auctioneers at home.



The team took the win 22-10 improving their record 3-1 for the season. Waccamaw had 245 yards of total offense; LaDarious Taylor led the team in rushing with 144 yards and one touchdown while RJ Knowlin also had a great game with 66 yards of rushing and two touchdowns. The defense was led by a trio of players: Tylik Edwards had two interceptions and a blocked field goal, Jordan Marshall had four tackles and two interceptions, and Jack King was the lead tackler with seven total tackles, four of which were sacks. "Overall, we are very happy for the win," says Coach King, "but we need to work on cleaning up the offensive mistakes. The Mullins defense played hard and we had trouble adjusting their formations during the first half of the game. After the half, the team came together to make the adjustments that were necessary for us to come out of top. I am extremely proud of their effort."

Last Friday night, October 3rd, the Waccamaw Warriors beat the Mullins Auctioneers 34-18. A big part of the win was Waccamaw's run game as Kevin Gasque had a 70-yard run, Tyriq Grant had an 80-yard run, and Justin Holmes had a 3-yard run, all for touchdowns. All parts of the offense were clicking as Tim Greene had a 22-yard touchdown reception from Trace Mills. Waccamaw started off with an early score after the defense stopped Mullins on the opening drive. Shortly after, Mullins scored but failed on the extra point. Waccamaw scored two more touchdowns before halftime and held the Auctioneers to 6 points with the score 21-6 at halftime. Light rain was not a problem for the Warriors as it rained from the start until the end of the third quarter where Jabbrel Drayton came up with a 35-yard fumble recovery for a defensive touchdown. Davis Hogan was 4 for 5 on extra points as Waccamaw breezed through an easy win against Mullins.

- Students need to bring to the test: two No. 2 pencils w/erasers, approved calculator (see above), and a jacket or sweatshirt in case the room is cold.
- Students are NOT allowed to bring to the test: protractors, compasses, rulers, dictionaries (or other books), pamphlets or papers of any kind, highlighters, colored pens, or pencils, listening, recording, copying, or photographic devices (including watches and cell phones that contain cameras), and food and beverages (including bottled water).
