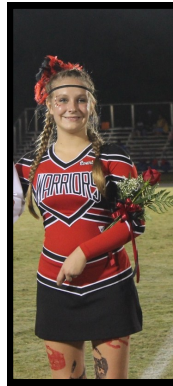

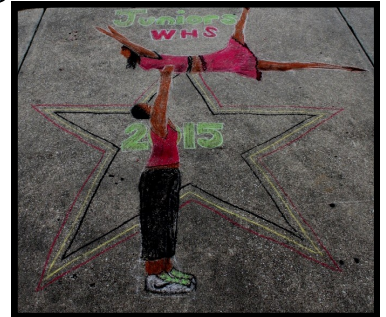

## Former Student Speaks at Anti-Bullying Summit

On September 24<sup>th</sup>, Blake Graham, a 2012 graduate of Waccamaw and youth ambassador for STOMPOUTBULLYING.org, was a keynote speaker at South Carolina's first Anti-Bullying Summit. This was held at the Columbia Metropolitan Convention Center, and 22 school districts attended including several hundred middle and high school students, school guidance counselors, administrators, and school resource officers. U.S. Attorney Bill Nettles spoke about bullying along with Interim Chief Rueben Santiago and State Superintendent of Education Mick Zais. The organizers of the summit say their goal is to encourage students and adults to work together to put a stop to bullying in and out of school. Blake, currently a sophomore at Coastal Carolina University, is a big advocate of anti-bullying. While in high school, he wrote two books on bullying and started the Anti-Bullying Walk in the Waccamaw Neck area. His sister, Connor Graham, continues his legacy representing Waccamaw High School at the summit.



## Homecoming Varsity Football Game

Last Friday night, the Warriors Varsity football team played their homecoming game against the Mullins Auctioneers. Waccamaw scored the first touchdown of the game in the first four minutes with a pass from quarterback Jalen Simmons to wide receiver Rob Ferraro. Mullins fought back, scoring on a long run. With 1:40 left in the first quarter, Waccamaw scored another touchdown after a long pass was caught by Ferraro.

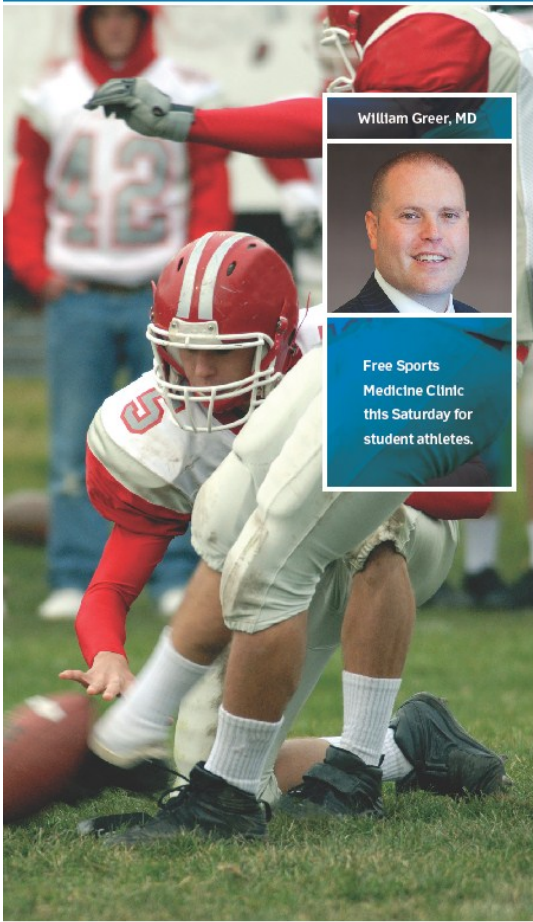

As the second quarter began Mullins scored and made a successful two point conversion. Waccamaw took possession, but Mullins intercepted the ball. Mullins found their way to the end zone again and made another two point conversion as the quarter ended. The score at halftime was 24-13.

In the third quarter, Simmons ran the ball in for a touchdown. An attempt for a two point conversion was made, but the Warriors failed to make it to the end zone, leaving the score at 24-19. Mullins fumbled the ball twice in the third quarter. They recovered the first, but superback/middle linebacker Justin Holmes recovered the second on the 22 yard line. The Warriors could not get a first down and were forced to punt. Mullins pushed the ball to the Warrior's 23 yard line, and fumbled again but recovered. On the next play, Mullins scored another touchdown, but failed their two point conversion attempt. The score at the end of 3rd quarter was Mullins 30, Warriors 19.

In the final quarter of the game, the Warriors scored a touchdown when Simmons passed the ball to wide receiver Jack Monroe, who ran it in.. After another attempt at a two point conversion, with the score at 30-25, the Warriors closely trailed behind Mullins. Mullins attempted to take over, but were forced to punt. Waccamaw got the ball back with five minutes left in the game, but Mullins intercepted a pass within the last three minutes and ran it down to the 21 yard line. Mullins scored another touchdown, but cornerback Darnell Dadd stopped the two point conversion. In the last minute of the game, Simmons passed the ball to Monroe, who scored the final touchdown of the game. The final score was Waccamaw 31, Mullins 36. Jabrel Drayton and Deandre Richardson lead the team in tackles. When asked about how the team played Coach Davis said, "Several injuries during the course of the game caused the staff to deviate from the original game plan, but the players remained focused and were in the game till the end."

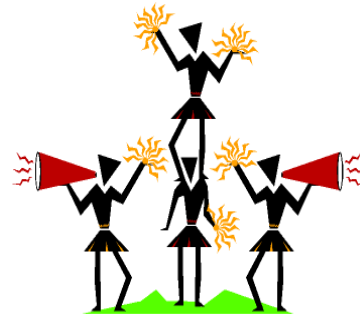
