On April 24th, WASA had its first Star Party on Pawleys Island from 7:30pm until 9:00pm. We were in hopes of seeing a scheduled ISS (International Space Station) fly across the Pawleys Island area. Some cloud cover to the east may have distorted our view because we never saw the ISS fly over. However, we did see some awesome sites; viewers saw the moon very clearly as well as several planets. One of the planets that was most inter-

esting in the southern sky was Jupiter; Jupiter has 56 moons and WASA was able to view two of those that stood out very distinctly from the bright part of the planet.

Ronnie Altman was invited to join WASA for the star party. He is very knowledgeable about using telescopes and knowing things about the universe. He brought his telescope and showed WASA students how to use it and what things to look for in the night sky. Senior Nick Streiffert brought his telescope and allowed viewers to look at a few night sky objects. WASA has a Meade telescope with an object finder computer; all one has to do is click on the object one would like to see and

the telescope will move automatically to that object in the sky. If you want to see the polar ice caps on Mars, click on Mars and the telescope will go there. Senior Connor Graham and junior Michael O'Neill were really interested in Jupiter and seeing its moons; science teacher Barbara O'Neill was looking at everything that we could see. Junior Jourdan Valderrama wanted to see everything too so we took all three scopes and looked at every celestial object we could see. The "star party" was a huge success and a lot of fun! Everyone is looking forward to another star party sometime in May.
