# Georgetown County Endures Historical Flooding

October 2<sup>nd</sup> began one of the largest and most extreme storms South Carolina has experienced in its history. Last week, Hurricane Joaquin missed the East Coast and created a "fire hose" of tropical moisture, aimed at the state. A solid week of rainfall caused hundreds of roads to be closed and left thousands without power or drinking water. Because of the extreme flooding and dangerous



conditions, people were urged to stay out of floodwaters due to the high risks while many areas were ordered a mandatory evacuation. By Monday afternoon, 550 roads were still closed and about 26,000 were without power or water. In areas such as Mount Pleasant and Charleston, more than 20 inches of rain fell. The conditions were less extreme in Pawleys Island and Myrtle Beach, but roads were closed due to excessive rainwater. The Andrews and Browns Ferry areas were hit the hardest and some of the people are still out of homes and recovering from damages. The Georgetown County School District monitored road conditions and safety and canceled school for all students and employees from Monday until Friday, Oct. 5-9th. On Monday, October 12th, officials decided to move from the save and rescue plan to the recovery plan for many South Carolina cities. Our entire community is blown away by the amount of devastation and destruction present after last week's flooding. As a whole, we have now seen firsthand how heartbreaking and difficult natural disasters can be. Some families around us have lost everything. Therefore, Waccamaw High School's Key Club and Student Council each felt the need to support and hopefully provide some relief. Key Club has teamed up with Tony's Famous Pizza, in Georgetown, to collect new backpacks and school supplies for students. The first set of backpacks will be delivered today! In addition, Student Council has gathered any personal items, like toiletries, to create "Personal Care Kits" with Ki9dness Captured for individuals and families in need. The smallest act of kindness can go a long way in times like these, so make sure to provide assistance in any way you can!



Dear Parent/Guardian:

In accordance with the United States Department of Education and the Office of Civil Rights, the Georgetown County School District is requiring all highs school students in grades 9- 12 to participate in a Title IX Student Training. 
