With six minutes left in the game, Mullins scored but didn't complete the two-point conversion. With two minutes left in the game, senior Colin Floyd secured the win with an interception. "It felt well deserved because we practice very hard in pass coverage and that's what we do," says Floyd about his crucial interception. 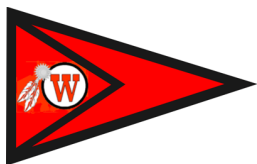

The weather reports painted a bleak picture for the entire day with heavy rains expected in the morning and again in the afternoon. The winds were to be light which is always a challenge, especially on Lake Norman. Five Warrior sailors made the trek: Griffin DesMarteau, Ella Grace Bodie, Noah Benton, Victoria Marinoff, and Anna Sandor. Coach Bob Turner rounded out the group along with several parents that had made the journey.

The sailors took to the water around 11:30am after a slight delay for the winds to build to a blustery 1.5 to 2 knots. For you sailors out there, as you know, not ideal conditions, but at least the rain held off. These very light winds were going to make the starts critical. As Coach Bob says, "Start off in the front and build on your lead." Coach Bob always keeps a positive attitude and tries to convey that to the sailors. Fleet A ended up with three races by the end of the day with a total score of 25 points. Fleet B also had three races with a total score of 23 points. The cumulative score of 48 points placed Waccamaw in 10th place overall, just 1 point out of 9th place. A total of 12 schools competed at this regatta, two schools from Georgia, five schools from North Carolina, and five schools from South Carolina.

The weekend of November 14th, the Warriors will be traveling to Raleigh, NC to compete in the Lake Crabtree Open Regatta. At last year's regatta, the Warriors brought home their first trophy. We wish our sailors well at Lake Crabtree.

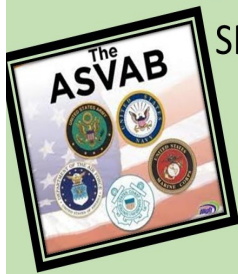

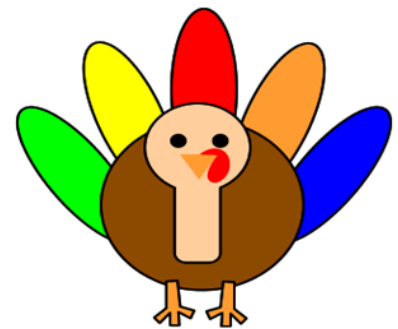
