### Girls and Boys Varsity Basketball Advancing in Region

The girls and boys varsity basketball team has three more games under their belt as they played Mullins, Loris, and Aynor in the past two weeks. On Tuesday, January 12<sup>th</sup>, Mullins traveled to WHS. The girls' team trailed throughout the game. The third quarter seemed promising as the Lady Warriors found their groove narrowing the score to 28-29. Unfortunately, the Lady Auctioneers took charge in the 4<sup>th</sup>, spreading the lead and ultimately, winning the game 55-39. Sisters Jada and Jazmyn Torrance were the leading scorers. Jada finished with a team-high of 13 points and Jaz had 8. The boys' team had a similar game with trouble in the first half allowing the Auctioneers to build an 18-point lead. At the end of the first half, Mullins was ahead 43-25. In the third quarter, Jawan Bryant played an excellent defense, holding the Auctioneers off the basket for nearly six minutes, all while scoring points for the Warriors. The team narrowed Mullins' lead to five, but just couldn't gain the lead. Waccamaw lost 77-69. Juniors Justin Busby and Bryant were the leading scorers with a teamhigh of 26 points for Busby and 21 points for Bryant.

The basketball teams traveled to Loris on January 14th. It was a tough game for the Lady

Warriors as they struggled to make baskets. It was also the first game without their starter, Dee Funnye. Funnye hurt her knee in the Mullins game and is out for now. Mullins beat the Lady Warriors 38-23. The boys' team had a good game against Mullins. At the end of the




first half, Waccamaw had a 4-point lead. The team didn't hold back in the second half going on a 18-5 run and heading to a victory with a final score of 55-38. Leading scorers were Busby with 17 points, Bryant with 16 points, and Kenley Vereen with 14.

The Warriors took the lead in the first quarter and never gave it up. They controlled the court third quarter with an 11-point spread, ending the quarter 29-12. Aynor attempted to come back in the fourth quarter, but Waccamaw held them basket-for-basket, securing their victory against Aynor.



On Thursday, January 21<sup>st</sup>, the boys JV team played Marion winning in a very close 35-34 game. Waccamaw ended the first quarter with a 4-point lead. The boys put up a fight in the second quarter, but weren't able to score, allowing 10 scored points for Marion ending the second quarter trailing 6-12. The Warriors defense stepped up in the second half, which was the key for their victory according to Coach Brown. In the third quarter, the Warriors pushed to within one. In the fourth quarter, the teams rallied back and fourth. The win was not determined until the last two seconds of the game when Alston shot and sunk the ball, taking the victory from Marion. Awesome job, Warriors!

On Monday, January 25<sup>th</sup>, the boys JV team picked up their fourth region win beating Dillon 31-28. Heimberger led with 9 points. Dillon dominated the first half, but Waccamaw came back in the second half leading in points to a victory. Alston was outstanding in rebounds and Heimberger had 5 out of 6 free throws from the line. The team's record is now 8-5.
