
Waccamaw Sailing Team North Points 4 Charleston Regatta

On February 20th the Warriors Sailing Team traveled to Charleston to compete in the North Points 4 Charleston Regatta. This was the 4th point's regatta of the season for the district. Nineteen teams were represented at the Carolina Yacht Club on East Bay Street, the host club. The teams were from North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia and all of them were prepared to utilize their best sailing talents to come out on top of the event. It is the race for the SAISA District Championships now with only three races after this one.

After picking up the boats at the Charleston Community Sailing Dock on the Ashley River, each team sailed the Charleston peninsula to begin racing on the Cooper River. The first race began around 10:30am, with winds out of the south at 10 knots. It was a little cloudy in the sky, but our sailors were ready for action.
