## **Waccamaw High School Ranked 17 in South Carolina High Schools**

U.S. News and World Report recently published their list of the top high schools in the nation, as well as within each state. These rankings are based on college and career readiness preparation, college readiness test scores, the student body, and teachers at each individual school. Waccamaw is listed as #17 in the State of South Carolina, ahead of St. James (#18), Aynor (#21), and Myrtle Beach (#23). The U.S. News and World Report's website assessed our rankings and broke it down. Last year, the students in the class of 2016 were tested through the South Carolina High School Assessment Program. In English, 48% of the 204 students tested performed at an Advanced level. 30% tested Proficiently, 18% at Basic, and only 4% at Below Basic. In Mathematics, 31% were Advanced, 30% Proficient, 29% Basic, and only 10% were Below Basic. These test results went into the calculations of the rankings for each school. Advanced Placement classes offered also played a role in determining each high school's ranking. Congratulations, students, teachers, and administration on an excellent ranking this year! We are Waccamaw!

# South Carolina Schools Move to 10-Point Grading Scale

Starting next school year, South Carolina schools will use a 10-point grading scale. This is the same scale that colleges operate on, as well as schools in most other states. SC students will now be on an equal playing field with students across the nation when competing for college acceptances. Changing the scale was about making education more fair and equal. This 10-point scale will benefit student's GPAs, transfers, college admissions, scholarship opportunities, and military families. The State Board of Education was unanimous when they voted in favor of this grading scale change.
