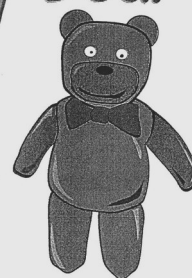

Softball Eliminated from Playoffs

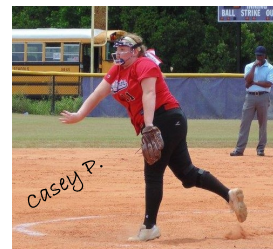



CALL ME MISTER FALL 2016 COHORT

Mentors Instructing Students Toward Effective Role Models

The Call Me MISTER (Mentors Instructing Students Toward Effective Role Models) Program is a statewide and national initiative. Its mission is to increase the pool of available teachers from a broader more diverse background particularly among the State's lowest performing elementary schools. College student participants with high academic potential, a demonstrated commitment to teach and a servant-leadership orientation are largely selected from among under-served, socio-economically disadvantaged and educationally at-risk communities.

As graduates, students are expected to have an impact by returning to critical need schools and communities to pursue their professional careers. To maximize opportunity and greater access, students will have the option of first attending Horry Georgetown Technical College before transferring to a four-year institution to complete their program of study in teacher education and baccalaureate degree. It is expected that a MISTER who completes his program of study and becomes certified to teach will assume a teaching position in a South Carolina public school and teach one year for each year they received financial support from the Call Me MISTER program.

Who Is Eligible to Apply?

To apply for the admittance into the Call Me MISTER program, a student must first apply for admission into HGTC and be accepted as a student.

How Do I Apply?

1. Complete the Call Me MISTER application.
2. Two letters of recommendation:
 - a) One letter from an educator or administrator representing the last school attended.
 - b) One letter from a person of the student's choice who can attest to the student's involvement in the community and/or potential for entering the teaching profession.
3. An essay titled "Why I Want to Teach" which will address the student's motivation for entering the teaching profession and the contributions he/she intends to make to the profession and the community as a teacher.
4. A signed statement titled "Why I Should Be Accepted into the Call Me MISTER Program"
5. A signed statement from a counselor or school official certifying that the student is from an under-served, under-privileged or economically disadvantaged background or area.
6. A copy of the student's most recent transcript.
7. The applicant must also complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).
