Competitive Speech Students Attend National Event

Amani Huell and Coya Darcangelo recently travelled to Lincoln, Nebraska for three days of competition at the National Individual Events Tournament of Champions. This prestigious national tournament requires students to earn "legs" throughout the speech season by placing high at a series of tournaments that are approved for size and rigor of competition. Both young ladies qualified in the event Dramatic Interpretation, in

which students must cut and edit a ten-minute cutting from a full-length play of high literary merit. Students memorize and block (add movement) to these pieces and frequently play multiple characters. Coya performed *Medea Redux* by Neil LaBute and Amani performed *Josephine and I* (a play about the legendary Josephine Baker) by Cush Jumbo.

Amani also qualified in Original Oration, an event in which students research, write, memorize, and perform a ten-minute persuasive speech on a topic of their choice.

In Dramatic Interpretation, 170 students participated at this national competition; Amani fought hard and eventually achieved the ranking of 7th in the nation! The team is extremely proud of her accomplishments.

In June, Amani will travel to Dallas, Texas, where she will compete in the National Speech and Debate Association's National Tournament, another tournament for which she qualified earlier in the season.

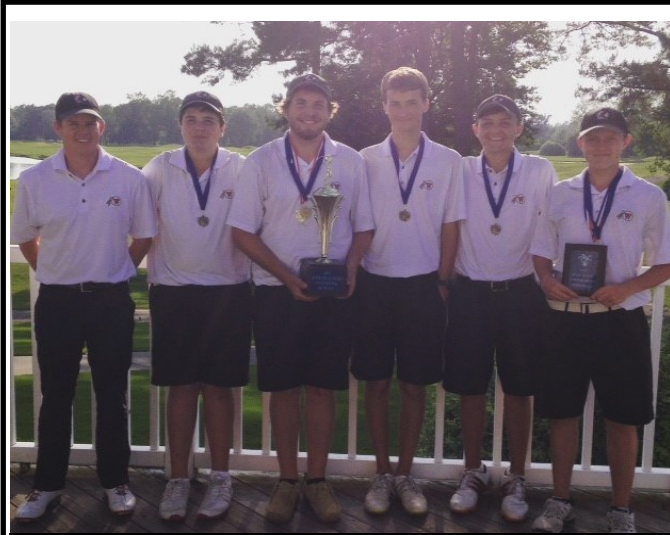

On Tuesday, May 11th, five players on the Waccamaw varsity golf team traveled to Black Bear Golf Course in Longs, S.C., to compete in the VIII AA Regionals. The team of Trey Salley, Will Canipe, Christopher Kaylor, Jackson Cole, and Patrick Golden beat Aynor, Loris, and Marion to take the Region title!

Coach Daily stated, "We didn't have our best stuff out there but we accomplished what we needed to make the AA State Championship. We had two goals going into the day: break our 18-hole scoring record of 291 and get four of the five players on the All Region team. We accomplished one of those goals and came up way short on the other with a team score of 307."

Congratulations to Will Canipe, Trey Salley, and Jackson Cole who were named to the All Region team and to Patrick Golden who was named Region Player of the Year.

The varsity golf team will compete in the State Championship Monday and Tuesday, May 18th-19th. "Looking ahead we'll need to play better to contend for the state championship but we're capable of doing so if we can get in the proper mindset. The championship should be a fun and really competitive event with the eventual winner coming down to Waccamaw or Bishop England. We'll need to shoot around 300 or better both days to take home the title. No matter what, it's been a very enjoyable and exciting year with lots of positives," says Coach Daily.

Varsity Baseball Defeats Bishop England

On Monday, May 11th, the Warrior baseball team faced Bishop England in the Lower State playoff bracket at home. The Warriors took the early lead in the first inning with a single by Carter Fox, driving in one run and leaving the score at 1-0 at the end of the first. The game stayed at a score of 1-0 until the fourth inning where Bishop England tied the game at 1-1. In the bottom of the sixth inning, Ethan Chastain hit a sacrifice fly to right field that scored one run to take the 2-1 lead. Tucker Perry did an amazing job on the mound throwing a complete game and giving up only one run. The Warriors ended the game with a great 2-1 victory to advance in the Lower State bracket.

Varsity Baseball Suffers Tough Loss to Dillon

On Tuesday, May 12th, the Warrior baseball team squared off against Dillon in the second game of the Lower State playoff bracket. Dillon took the early lead, scoring one run in the second inning. The game was very close up until the fourth inning where Dillon scored eight runs to take the 9-0 lead. Christian Hendrickson and Karl Strittmatter did well pitching the last three innings in relief to stop the bleeding. Dillon scored one last run in the top of the seventh to extend their lead to 10-0. 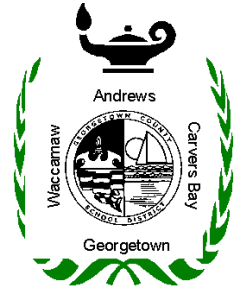

Georgetown County School District Honors Certificate



Criteria:

1. A minimum of 28 Carnegie Units and qualify for a South Carolina high school certificate
2. A minimum Grade Point Average of 3.5 on the State Uniform Grading Scale
3. A minimum composite SAT score of 1200 or a composite ACT score of 27
4. A minimum of three (3) courses at the Advanced Placement (AP), or College (Dual Credit) level with 2 of the 3 at the AP level.
5. Three Carnegie Units of foreign language
6. Students will present evidence of participation in one school-sponsored organization such as athletics, academic team, student government, clubs, etc. each year in grades 9-12, or complete 50 hours of approved community service accumulated during high school

Final determination of eligibility for the Honors Certificate will be made after the 135th day of school in the semester prior to graduation. Schools, in consultation with the appropriate district administration, will retain the right to revoke the Honors Certificate in the event of any egregious offense(s).

South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Award

For a student to receive a South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Award, the student must meet the following criteria:

- complete twenty-four units of credit as prescribed;
- meet the standard on all subtests of the Exit Examination;
- receive a minimum grade of "B" for each semester course in grades 9–12 through the seventh semester; and
- achieve either a score of 710 or higher on the SAT verbal, a score of 690 or higher on the SAT mathematics, a score of 30 or higher on the ACT English, or a score of 33 or higher on the ACT mathematics;

- OR -

- each student shall have completed twenty-four units of high school credit;
- be eligible for graduation with a state high school diploma; and
- have a combined score of 1400 on the SAT verbal and math sections, or an ACT composite score of 31.

Of the twenty-four units earned, **eighteen units** must be **college preparatory coursework**, four units in additional electives, and two units in one or more of the following: English, science, social studies, or mathematics.

College preparatory coursework includes the following:

- English (English I or above), four units;
- mathematics (Algebra I or above), four units;
- laboratory science, three units; social studies (United States/South Carolina studies, economics/ government and one unit of global studies/world history, global studies/ world geography or western civilization), three units;
- computer science, one unit;
- physical education, one unit; and foreign language, two units.
