



### Waccamaw Boys' Golf Team

## CLASS AA STATE CHAMPIONS!

On Monday and Tuesday, May 16th-17th, the boys' golf team played 15 other teams for the Class 2A State Championship at True Blue Golf Club in

Pawleys Island, a par-72 golf course. The WHS team of Patrick Golden, Will Canipe, Trey Salley, Jackson Cole, and Chris Kaylor had an outstanding two days of tournament play. The team's goal this season was to win the championship, and they did. What was not anticipated was breaking the lowest team score in Class AA history by 7 shots, and having a player break the record for the lowest 36-hole individual score in the South Carolina High School League by 5 shots. However, the Waccamaw boys' golf team did both. Despite strong winds on Day 1 of the championship round, Waccamaw posted the best team score shooting 2-over par (290), and Golden posted the best individual score with a 67 (5-under par). It was a great day for Waccamaw. They finished the day with a 7 shot lead over the defending champs, Bishop England. On Tuesday, Waccamaw continued their great play. Even heavy rainfall near the end of the final round did not deter them.

#### AP Calculus Tea Lanterns

During the week of May 9<sup>th</sup>, Ms. Graham's AP Calculus students were assigned to assemble tea lanterns. With a partner, the students drew an original shape that would be the basis for their structure. The students located the maximum and minimum points of their shape on a graph and divid-





ed the shape into intervals to find the




equation of the curves. They cut the shape and chose 2-3 different construction paper colors to create the lantern. Then, they made a cylinder where they taped or stapled 12 of the shapes around the outside. Once they were complete, Ms. Graham displayed all of the students' lanterns by attaching them to a rope.

#### The Spiny Dogfish Shark

Sharks in the water might be a frightening sight, but sharks in Mrs. O'Neill's lab, not so much! Last week her Marine Biology students dissected the Spiny Dogfish shark, or *Squalus*, to be more specific. On the first day of dissection, the students evaluated the external features of the shark and discovered how much the "skin" felt smooth in one direction but like sand paper when stroked in the opposite direction. The students had to determine the gender of their shark as well. That was an easy task since male sharks have claspers, an external appendage that females do not.

During the internal dissection, the students were fascinated by the three large, oily liver lobes. They dissected the small heart and cut it in half observing the heart chambers. Some of the stomach contents were large shrimp, fish, and even worms! The larger female sharks had pups in them as well. That was a very cool sight to see. They were attached to a yolk sac for their nourishment. Some

The team shot 3-over par (291) in the final round with a team score of 581, 15 shots ahead of Bishop England. Golden surpassed his first day score of 67 finishing the final round with a 64 (8-under par). His two-day score of 131 broke the all-time scoring record in the state of South Carolina by 5 shots. Bill Haas, PGA tournament player, broke the record in 2000 and Trevor Muffley tied Haas' record in 2005. Canipe finished in third place with rounds of 73-73, and Cole finished tied for tenth with rounds of 75-76. Golden, Canipe, and Cole were all named to the all-state team. Salley narrowly missed out on all-state after rounds of 75-78 and Kaylor rounded out the scoring for Waccamaw with rounds of 81-78. Coach Daily stated, "This is an impressive collection of boys that have a very bright future ahead of them. It's been a pleasure to coach them the past several years." Congratulations to the team, to Patrick Golden, and to Coach Daily on an awesome season!

The last state championship for the WHS boys' golf program was in 2009. Prior to this week, Aynor held the record for the lowest team score at 588 and Bill Haas (PGA tournament player) and Trevor Muffley held the record for the lowest 36-hole individual record at 136.

History was made this weekend as the Waccamaw track and field team traveled to Spring Valley High School to compete in the state championship meet. The Warriors won big, bringing home a silver medal for the boys and a gold medal for the girls. Before Saturday, the girls track team had never won a state championship, but this changed as the team pulled out a score of 69, two points higher than the second place team, to take home the AA state title. This is especially historic for the Warriors because this is the first year that both the girls cross country and track teams have won state championships in the same year. In the first event of the day, the Warriors were off to a great start, with the 4x800 relay team of Amelia Jones, Briley Arnold, Mary Butler DeSpain, and Samantha Kelly winning first place. Following this, the athletes kept the pedal down with sophomore Briley Arnold winning the 100m hurdles with a time of 16.16 seconds. Arnold was not favored to win this race, but by finishing in first, she brought in major points for the team. She continued her winning streak by finishing first in the 400m hurdles with a time of 1:04.68. Arnold now has eight state titles to her name, and has the potential to win many more with the Warriors. Another outstanding athlete for Waccamaw, Jones, had a great day,

adding two individual state titles to her name. With her victory in the 4x800m relay and the 3200m, Jones finished her career at Waccamaw with a whopping nine state titles. The 4x400m relay team of Brianna Brooks, Mary Katherine Kelly, Tyaisha Edwards, and Briley Arnold also brought in points for the Warriors with their sixth place finish. DeSpain finished second in the 800m and seventh in the 1600m, Jones fourth in the 1600m, Edwards fourth in the 400m and sixth in the 100m, and Jamisa Lewis sixth in the shot put, all adding up to the victory for Waccamaw. Way to go, ladies!

Finishing runner-up in the AA division, the boys had a huge day as well. The team only qualified for five events, but was able to win big individually in order to bring points to the team. Sophomore Jackson Junkins added two state championships to his name as he won the 200m and 400m, finishing five hundredths of a second behind the state record in the 200m and less than a second behind the state record in the 400m. Junkins also competed in the pole vault, finishing third overall and adding six points to the team's total score. The 4x400m relay team of Jakeem Armstrong, Alani Scott,

Darnell Dadd, and Junkins finished second and the 4x800 relay team of Jeremy Green, Matt MacLeod, Perrin Jones, and William Daniels brought in points as well, finishing in fifth place, rounding out the team score to a total of 38 points, putting them in second place in AA. Go Warriors! All of these victories would not have been possible without the help of the coaches: Head Coach Bill Peterman, Brian White, Eric Sparkman, Tracy Knox, Bob Siemeda, and Elliott Haynie. Congratulations, coaches and athletes!



#### SPACE EXPLORATION:

Monday – Thursday, July 11 – 14, 2016 9:00am – 12:00pm

This class is for students completing 5<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Students will learn about where America is going next, including the International Space Station, the moon, near Earth Asteroids and Mars. Students will investigate and experiment with scientific principles relating to space exploration. They will interact with an educational specialist from the Johnson Space Center. Emphasis will be on critical thinking, problem solving, and deductive reasoning skills. Cost: \$100 which includes tuition and all rocket materials.

#### SPACE CITIES:

Monday – Thursday, July 11 – 14, 2016 12:30pm – 4:30pm

This class is designed for students completing 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4<sup>nd</sup> grades. Students will learn about living and working in Space, where astronauts sleep, how they eat, exercise, and spend their free time. They will design and build space stations in cooperative groups using recycled materials and participate in activities involving EVA assimilations, hands-on science experiments dealing with gravity, space mud and astronaut foods. Students will develop their imagination and creativity skills. They will learn about contributions NASA has made to improve the quality of life on earth. Students are welcome to repeat this class as many times as they like creating new space stations each year. Cost: \$100 which includes tuition and all materials.

#### The Instructors:

The teaching team will be composed of Connie Richardson Smith, an educator/consultant/Morningside College adjunct instructor. Co-teaching is Mary Richardson Tester, who teaches high school special education at Waccamaw High and Ben Tester, who teaches 7th grade science at Waccamaw Middle. Connie and Mary have successfully taught this aerospace science camp for many years adding new features each year. Both teachers have completed graduate work at the University of Iowa in Science Education through the Iowa Chautauqua Program. They have completed teacher training at the Johnson Space Center through the Space Exploration Educators Conference and Mary attended MoonKam training in Las Vegas through the Sally Ride Science Institute. Connie attended the International Space Station conference in Boston last summer sponsored by the American Astronautical Society. This summer we are fortunate to have Ben join the team to co-teach the Space Exploration Class. He is a recent graduate of the College of Charleston and a former student of Space Camp.
