Fourteen years ago today, one of the most widely known and most devastating tragedies took place in New York City, Washington, D.C., and Pennsylvania. A terrorist group known as Al-Qaida hijacked four airliners, Flight 11, Flight 175, Flight 93, and Flight 77

and attacked our country. The terrorists flew one airliner into the side of the North Tower of the World Trade Center and 18 minutes later, a second airliner into the South Tower of the World Trade Center. The explosions caused the towers to weaken and by 10:30am both towers had collapsed, scattering debris all over the surrounding buildings and streets below. Roughly 3000 people died in the World Trade Center, those that worked there, as well as firefighters, NYC police officers, and Port Authority officers who were inside the Trade Center helping save people who were trapped in the towers. Meanwhile, the other two airliners that were hijacked were headed towards the White House and the Pentagon. Flight 77 crashed into the west side of the Pentagon, causing many civilian casualties as well as all the passengers and crew on the airliner. The fourth airliner, Flight 93, was steered off course by courageous passengers who heard about the other hijacked airliners and took action to control the airliner. The airliner crashed in a field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Some say the airliner was headed to the White House or the U.S. Capitol. There were no survivors in the crash. It was a somber day for the nation as they watched in horror the attack on our country. In a televised address from the Oval Office, President Bush declared, "Terrorist attacks can shake the foundations of our biggest buildings, but they cannot touch the foundation of America. These acts shatter steel, but they cannot dent the steel of American resolve." In the aftermath of 9/11, the nation mourned the lives lost. Time has helped our country heal, but the memories will never be forgotten.

On September 11, 2011, the National September 11 Memorial and Museum opened as a tribute to those who lost their lives that tragic day, to the survivors and their loved ones. The Memorial, located at the site of the former World Trade Center, features two enormous waterfalls and reflecting pools set within the footprints of the twin towers. Around the reflecting pools are names of the lives lost on this tragic day. The Museum is an educational and historical institution honoring the victims' through artifacts and records.

Today marks the 14th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. It is a day that will forever be in the hearts of Americans.

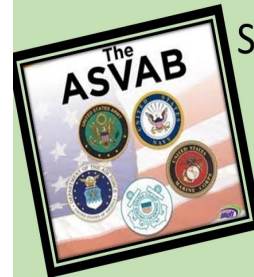
