WHS Students attend the Black Caucus Youth Leadership

Aniyah Clark, Destini Greene, Miles Gunn, Allayah Simmons, and Bradford Thompson, along with other students from the

Georgetown County School District, attended the Youth Leadership Legislative Session in Columbia on September 14th. Students from across the state participated in a mock session, sponsored by South Carolina Legislative Black Caucus. They represented South Carolina House and Senate, debating on issues that are or have been before the House and Senate.

Below are some of the bills the students debated.

- ◆ S3042 Prohibition on texting while driving. Makes it unlawful for a person to use a handheld wireless electronic communication device while operating a motor vehicle. (This bill was passed by the Student Body).
- ◆ H3043 Body worn cameras for law enforcement officers. Require state and local law enforcement agencies to implement the use of body worn cameras. (This bill was passed and signed by Governor Nikki Haley).
- ◆ S3044 Medical marijuana program act. To authorize the palliative use of marijuana by certain individuals with certain diseases and medical conditions. (This bill was passed by the Student Body).
- ◆ H3045 Removal of confederate monuments from State house grounds. To authorize the removal of all confederate monuments from the South Carolina state house grounds. (This bill was passed by the Student Body).

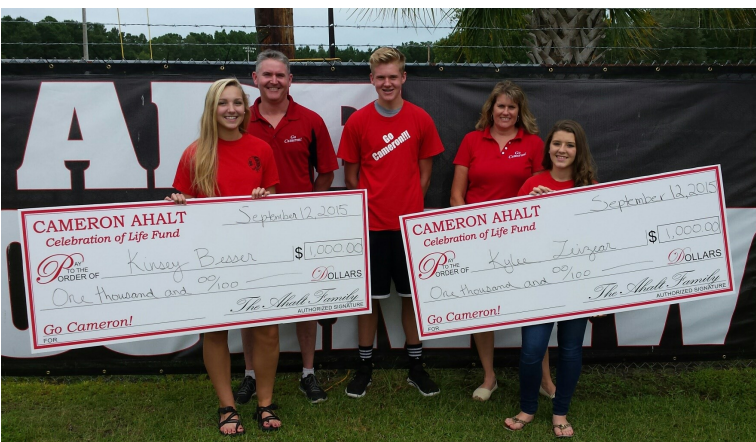
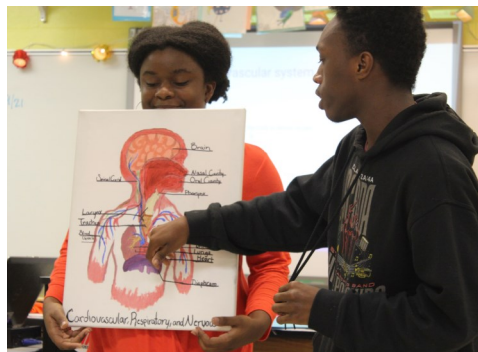
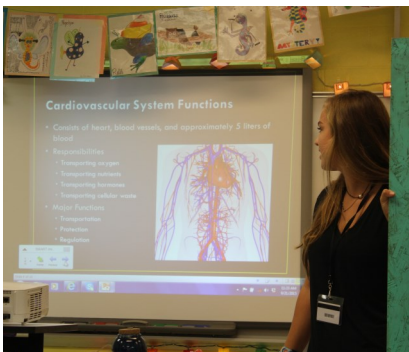
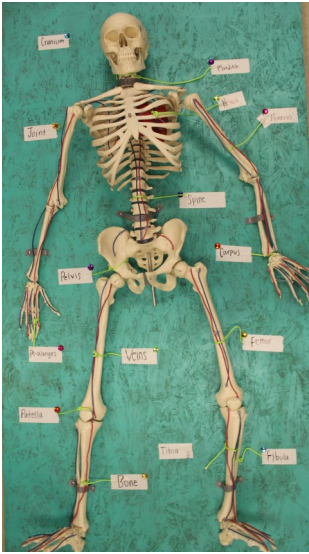
and Wales has many other majors including; criminal justice, business studies, management, marketing, and hospitality.

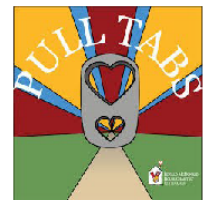

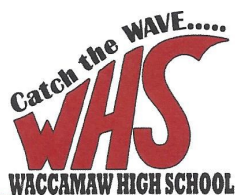

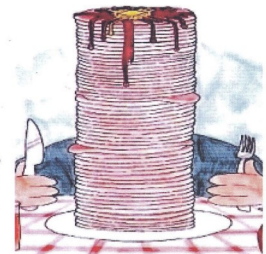

Vegetarian Thai Coconut Curry

Servings:

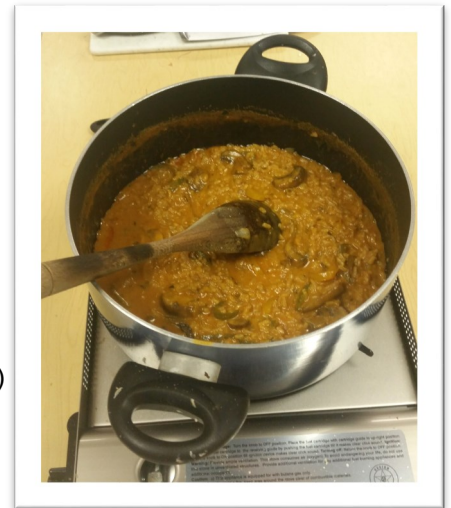
Prep Time: 15 Minutes

Cook Time: 30 Minutes

Ready In: 45 Minutes

Ingredients:

- ½ Green Bell Pepper (Julienne)
- ½ Yellow Bell Pepper (Julienne)
- 1 Cup Sliced Mushrooms
- ½ Yellow Onion, (Diced)
- 2 Cloves of Garlic (Minced)
- 3-5 Tablespoons of Red Curry Paste (Adjust to desired heat)
- 1 Can of Sweetened Coconut Milk
- ½ Container of Vegetable Broth or Chicken Broth
- A Pinch of Basil (Chiffonade)
- 2 Tablespoons of Brown Sugar
- 1 Bag of Boil in a Bag Brown Rice



Method of Preparation:

In a medium sized pot, heat small amount of olive oil in bottom of pan, then sauté the yellow onion, and garlic. Then add in the green and yellow bell peppers, and the mushrooms. Keep stirring them until softened.

Add in the curry paste. Depending on how spicy you want the dish, add anywhere from 3 to 5 tablespoons. Continue to stir in the curry paste.

Once curry paste is mixed in, add 1 can of coconut milk and stir around.

Add in ½ container of vegetable or chicken broth. Continue to stir.

Once it comes up to a boil, add in the Boil in the Bag brown rice. Stir until evenly mixed.

Let rice cook with all ingredients for about 10 min.

Once rice is cooked, add in the basil, and brown sugar, serve and enjoy!
