#### Prom Promise: Don't Drive Under the Influence

Waccamaw's annual Prom Promise assembly happened on Monday, March 21<sup>st</sup>, with Mr. Jon Tester as the speaker. Mr. Tester, many of whom had him as their elementary Principal, spoke of the dangers of driving while under the influence. While giving students statistics, he sought to encourage students to be safe, not just on prom night, but all of the time. After Mr. Tester spoke, students walked out to the back parking lot where they witnessed a crash scene where a drunk driver had hit another car. Senior Aaron Jordan played the drunk driver, who was shown receiving a field sobriety test and later arrested. Senior Jed Parreno played the passenger in the drunk driver's car, who was ejected from the car because he was not wearing a seat belt and pronounced dead on arrival. Seniors Evelyn Frobey and Alexis Welch played students who were hit head on from the drunk driver, both injured. The Midway Fire Department used the "jaws of life" to cut out Welch, who was critically injured. The firemen had to break glass, cut metal, and medically secure the student before she could be safely brought out of the truck. A helicopter showed up to transport the critically injured student to the hospital. At the end of the reenactment, Dr. Hammel told the students to make this not just a prom promise, but a life promise to not drink and drive.

A special thanks to Mr. Jon Tester, Midway Fire and Rescue, Georgetown Sheriff's Department, Carlo's Complete Car Care for providing the cars, the seniors who acted, Prom Sponsors Mrs. Tester and Mrs. Griffin, and especially to firefighter Joe Palombi who contacted the school with the idea of this reenactment and made arrangements for all rescue personnel on the scene.
