The Warriors produced 13 runs out of 11 hits and only one error. Karl Strittmatter did a great job pitching, facing 17 batters, and striking out 10. It was Strittmatter's first no-hitter and the coaches couldn't be prouder. The sluggers of the night were Daniel Rourk, who went 2-3 with two RBIs and two runs scored, and Reed Edwards, who went 2-3 with two RBIs. Great game Warriors! The final score of the night was 13-0.

On Friday, April 15th, the Waccamaw Warrior varsity baseball team hopped on the old yellow bus and booked it up to Marion for the first pitch of the game at 6:30pm. To start off the bats for Waccamaw, Connor Eckard came out swinging with a double on his first at bat. He would end up being driven in, plus one more, to get a good start in the 1st inning. The top sluggers of the night were Alex Altman, who went 3-3 with one RBI, and Connor Eckard, who went 2-3. The bats may have been screaming, but the pitching was on point too. Levi Almond did a phenomenal job on the mound, pitching all seven innings of the game with a total of 88 pitches for the night, 17 strikeouts, and 0 walks. He had a perfect game brewing up, but with some early talk about it from a couple of players in the dugout, a fly ball was hit deep into centerfield and broke up the perfect game in the bottom of the 7th inning. Never fear, the one-hitter is now here; no matter that one hit, the coaches couldn't be prouder of their pitching staff. The Warriors took the win 10-0.

On Tuesday, April 19th, the varsity team played the Loris Lions on the old Waccamaw diamond. The players knew it would be a scrappy game so they went out and took care of business. Waccamaw stroked the ball well by producing 10 runs off of 9 hits. The sluggers of the night were Almond, who went 2-2 with two runs brought in, Forrest Powell, who went 2-4 with one RBI, and McKinley Grooms, who went 1-1 with one run scored. Dylan Leatherwood was brought in the game late to take the role as a designated hitter. He put some good heat on the ball and cracked open the inning with a single. Using his lightning speed, Leatherwood reached second. Carter Fox did a tremendous job on the mound only allowing three hits and one run. Waccamaw beat Loris 10-1.

On Wednesday, April 20th, the varsity baseball team celebrated Senior Night before the start of the game against Andrews. Nine seniors were recognized (see picture at right). In the game, the score remained 0-0 until the 4th inning when Waccamaw took control of the game. They allowed only one run taking the win 8-1.

Last night, April 21st, Waccamaw played their last game of the regular season against Aynor, the region champs. Waccamaw lost by one run, 2-3. Almond performed well on the mound and Altman had a homerun.

The Warrior varsity baseball team finished the regular season 16-8 overall, 7-3 in region, locking up 2nd place in regions.



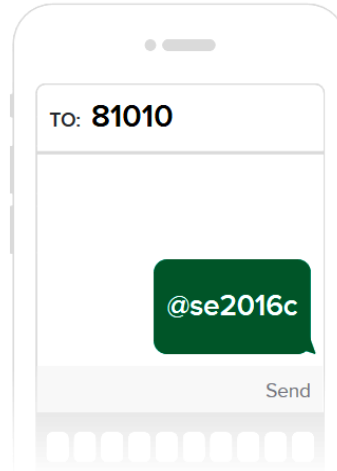
