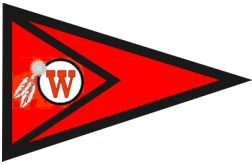

Charleston Open Saturday September 17

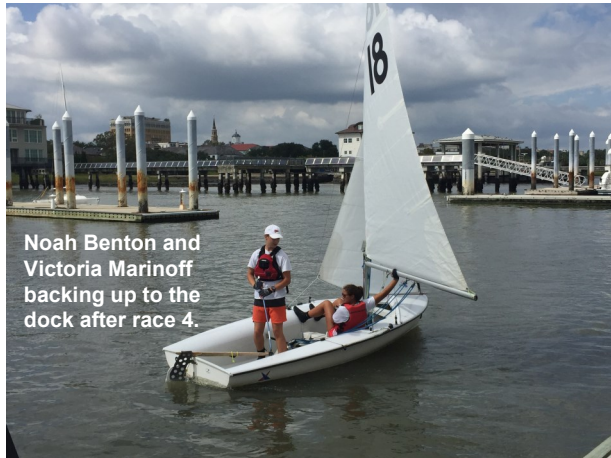
The Warriors Sailing Team competed in the first regatta of the season, the Charleston Open, at Carolina Yacht Club located in downtown Charleston on Saturday, September 17th. Weather conditions challenged sailors all day with changing wind speed and direction (4-10 knots N/NW) along with strong currents (up to 6 knots). A total of 18 teams from three states competed in the series of races. Waccamaw Sailing Club finished 14th overall. Representing the A-Fleet series were juniors Noah Benton and Victoria Marinoff with an overall score of 34, taking 6th place. The A-Fleet competed in four races: one 3rd place, two 6th places, and one OCS (On Course Side means they were over early at the start, which set them back in the final standings.) At times, it was nearly impossible for A-Fleet to sail to the windward mark against changing tide and current, proving a difficult course. Representing the B-Fleet series were freshmen Ella Smith and Max Golden with an overall score of 75, taking 18th place. The

B-Fleet sailed very well for their first varsity regatta, but each race was consistently challenged by difficult conditions of light wind and strong currents which affected all sailors, even ones with experienced teams.

The sailors will miss going to Sunbury next weekend and will head to Brunswick, GA on October 8th for the Brunswick Open. The Warriors Sailing Team salutes Sydney Register, an alumnus of the WHS team, for her 1st place finish for the A-Fleet series at the Charleston Open.
