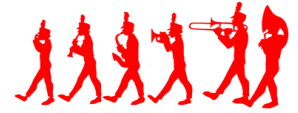

Boys' Swim Team finishes 4th in State Championship!

With only 10 swimmers in the program this year, the Waccamaw swim team still had an outstanding season. Last Saturday, October 15th, the WHS girls and boys swim team competed in the 2016 SCHSL 3A State Swimming Championship in Columbia, SC. This was the first state meet in nine seasons where every single swimmer qualified for state in individual events. In Saturday's state championship, the WHS boys' team finished 4th out of 20 teams and brought home two



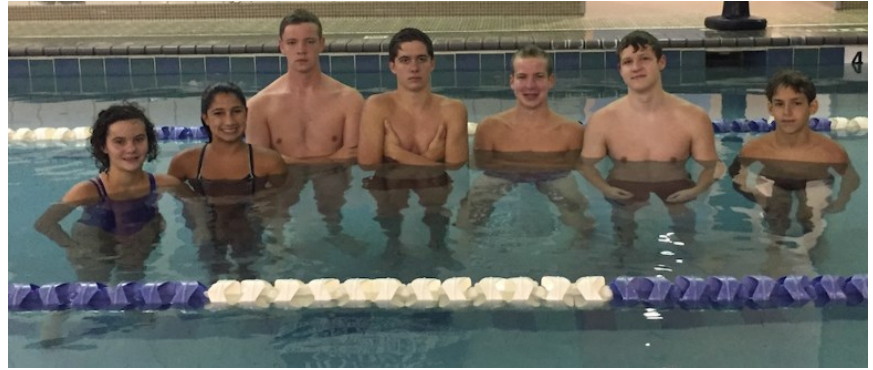

gold medals in team events and two gold, two silver, and one bronze medal in individual events. "Defending our state titles in the 200 and 400 freestyle relays was a real priority for us," says Coach Dear. "It was kind of an unspoken thing-this is ours and no one's taking this from us. Those boys swam with a lot of heart and got the job done." The WHS girls' team had two swimmers - Emma Sullivan and Victoria Marinoff. They finished 13th out of 18 state teams and Sullivan brought home a silver medal. Awesome job, swimmers! Coach Dear stated, "We had a slogan we started saying - Teamwork makes the dream work! And it worked for us on Saturday, with every swimmer earning points. That doesn't happen very often-that's a once in a decade kind of thing."

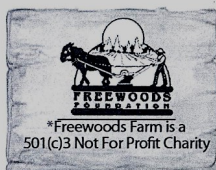

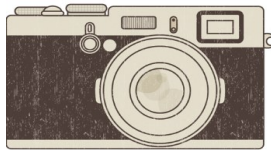
