To be considered for a nomination, a student must submit an application, SAT/ACT scores, transcript, and three letters of recommendation. Then after being interviewed by the community, members of the military, and alumni of the academy, the student must be nominated by a member of Congress. Griffin is one of fifty South Carolina students appointed by Senator Tim Scott. After he graduates, Griffin will spend seven years in the Navy Reserve working on U.S. ships. Griffin leaves June 28th.
