
#### **Boys Lacrosse Comes Back**


### **Mingo Bay Baseball Tournament**



## Track and Field Competes in the Beach Run Invitational





# A Reminder of Prom Rules and Ticket Information

- Prom will be held on Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup> at 8:00pm at Heritage Plantation in Pawleys Island.
- Proper formal attire is required.
- Students must be present at school on Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup> through second period to be eligible to attend prom. Tickets will not be given out prior to this date and time to confirm school attendance.
- Tickets can be picked up in the atrium upon parent approved sign-out or at the end of the day. Each student must pick up their own ticket unless date is not a WHS student.
- A WHS ID or SC driver's license will be required at the door when entering prom along with the purchased ticket. Each attendee must present a ticket at the door.
- After check in at Prom, students will not be allowed to reenter if they leave.
- Only seniors will vote for Prom King & Queen.
   Seniors will vote as they enter the door on prom night.
- Crowning will be held at 10:30pm at the prom. The winners must be present to accept the crown or the runners up will be crowned.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the building and outside on the premises.
- Anyone, regardless of age, who arrives at the prom under the influence of alcoholic beverages or any other illegal substance, will be denied entrance.
